## Stevens Athletics Week in Review

March 17, 2009

### Baseball

Overall record ..... 4-7  
 Empire 8 record ..... 0-0

\* Sophomore infielder **Ken Meerendonk** went 5-for-5 on the day and allowed five hits through seven innings pitched to help lift the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team to a pair of wins against the City College of New York on Saturday in Hoboken, N.J. Junior outfielder **Anthony Andrews** drove in five runs on two hits, while the Ducks launched six homers on the day; including two from freshman infielder **Tom Phillips**. Stevens rolled over the Beavers in Game 1 (19-4), and then came back in the night cap to close out the sweep with an 8-1 victory. The Ducks improve to 4-7 on the year as CCNY drops to 0-11.

\* Stevens set the tone early as the Ducks scored six runs during the first inning of Game 1. With men on first and second, junior outfielder **Russ Grimes** delivered a double down the left-field line to plate junior outfielder **Mark Rasulo** as Meerendonk advanced to third. After a walk by sophomore catcher **Denis Ackermann**, the following batter, junior short-stop **Eddie Daniele**, drove in Meerendonk. Stevens scored four more runs, all of which came off of errors by the Beavers.

\* Stevens held a 4-1 lead after three innings in game two and put the game out of reach in the fifth. Stevens tacked on four more runs in the fifth. Rasulo started things off with a single to centerfield. He then stole second as Phillips reached base on a walk. Following a pitching change, a double steal was executed as the catcher sent the ball into right on the throw down to third. Rasulo scored on the error as Phillips advanced to third. Meerendonk then singled to left field to plate Phillips for the second run of the inning. With the bases juiced, Daniele dug in to the batters box and ripped a single to left field to score Meerendonk. After the second pitching change of the inning, Andrews lifted a sacrifice fly to deep center, which drove in Grimes as he was tagging on the play.

\* The pitching staff was able to shutdown the Beavers in the final two innings as the Ducks record their fourth win of the season. Sophomore pitcher **Dan Anunziata** earned the victory for his five innings of work. He gave up just one earned run on seven hits in 19 batters faced. Sophomore **Kyle Hanas** came in the eighth and was lights out, having allowed a hit. Freshman pitcher **T.J. Griffin** was just as good as came in for the ninth to close things out. Meerendonk batted 2-for-2 with two runs scored and a pair of RBI. Phillips had two hits and two RBI in three at-bats as Rasulo finished 2-for-3 with a pair of runs scored.

\* The Ducks return to the diamond on Wednesday when they play host to New Jersey City University at 3 p.m.

## Equestrian

\* Stevens Equestrian opened the spring portion of the schedule with a fourth-place finish at the SUNY New Paltz Show and a fifth-place finish at the William Paterson Horse Show.

\* New Paltz won its own show with 42 points and Centenary College was second with 41. Junior **Kahri Olsen** earned the top spot in the open fences to lead the Stevens point riders.

\* Olsen also finished sixth in the open flat. Junior **Jamie Fishbein** took a fourth and a second on the day. She took fourth in the intermediate fences and second in the intermediate flat. Sophomore **Angela Parriott** earned fourth-place finishes in the novice fences and novice flat. Junior **Constance Maglaras** was fifth in the walk-trot canter, and junior Regina Pynn was sixth in the walk trot. Newcomer **Madalyn Kulas** took second in her first walk-trot class of the season.

\* Stevens has already qualified four riders for Regionals. Olsen has qualified in the open fences, and junior captain **Rosemary Garofalo** has qualified in the intermediate flat. Fishbein has qualified in two events, the novice flat and novice fences, while Parriott will compete in the advanced walk-trot canter.

\* Stevens finished with 26 team points at the William Paterson Show, and Centenary College won with a total of 33. SUNY New Paltz finished second and was followed by Sarah Lawrence College and William Paterson in third as the United States Military Academy came in fourth. Sophomore **Angela Parriott** had the best finish for the Ducks, placing first in the novice fences and earning seven team points. Junior **Kahri Olsen** was fourth (three points) in the open fences and fourth in the open flat and junior captain **Rosemary Garofalo** was fifth (two points) in the intermediate fences. Junior **Jamie Fishbein** took two third-place finishes (six total points), one in the intermediate fences and one in the intermediate flat. In addition to her first, Parriott took a fifth in the novice flat. Junior **Regina Pynn** carded a fourth-place finish in the walk-trot canter. **Madalyn Kulas** earned the team five points with her finish in the advanced walk-trot canter (second place).

\* The Ducks will return to action on March 29 at the Regional Championship Show at Briarwood Farm in Readington, N.J.

## Men's Lacrosse

Overall record .....3-2  
 Empire 8 record .....0-0

\* On Friday evening in Boca Raton, Fla., the Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team won its second consecutive game, defeating Kenyon College 8-4 at St. Andrews High School. Stevens scored three goals within a span of 17 seconds in the third quarter to break the game open and the Lords could never recover. The Ducks were led by two goals and an assist from senior attackman **J.R. Oreskovich**.

\* Seven different Ducks scored on the day and sophomore goalie Dave Decker was fantastic in goal for Stevens, making nine saves and picking up three ground balls to earn his third win of the season.

\* The two teams each won eight of the 16 face-offs as Kenyon scooped up 37 ground balls, compared to 26 for Stevens. Stevens (3-2) outshot Kenyon 33-30 and the Ducks' defense killed off all three man-up chances for the Lords.

\* Kenyon (1-3) held the Ducks scoreless in the first and scored the first goal of the second quarter to take a 2-0 lead. The Ducks however responded with three-straight scores over the next 9:21 of game time to take a 3-2 lead going into the locker room. The goals came from senior attackman **Matt Keating**, senior captain **Alex Heckman**, and Oreskovich.

\* Stevens tallied two of the first three scores in the second half to gain a 5-3 edge with 7:27 left. Neither team could score for the next six-plus minutes of the quarter but with 54 ticks to go, the Ducks erupted for their three-goal outburst to essentially put the game away.

\* Freshman **Kevin Rose** scored first as Keating was credited with the assist, sophomore **Jacob Messimer** was next with an unassisted goal, and a sophomore midfielder **Brandon Faubert** put the Ducks up 8-3.

\* Keating finished with a goal, two assists, and a team-high four ground balls as Messimer and sophomore defenders Ted Pfeifer and Zach McHugh each had three ground balls.

\* The Ducks return to action on Wednesday at 7 p.m. versus No. 6 Endicott College. It is the teams' Duck Country game and all fans in attendance are encouraged to wear yellow.

\* Stevens will open Empire 8 play on Saturday night at 7 p.m. versus Utica College.
