Stevens Athletics Week in Review

March 24, 2009

Baseball

Overall record7-7
 Empire 8 record0-0

* Sophomore infielder **Ken Meerendonk** batted 3-for-5 on the day with a pair of homers and four runs batted in to help the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team record a pair of wins in its twin bill against Skidmore College on Saturday afternoon. The Ducks defeated the Thoroughbreds, 7-3 in Game 1 and posted a 3-2 victory in the night cap. Meerendonk earned a win to improve to 2-1 on the year for his seven innings of work; having allowed eight hits and just an earned run. Stevens improves to 7-7 on the year as Skidmore drops to 5-7.

* Junior centerfielder **Mark Rasulo** came in to score as junior right fielder **Russ Grimes** was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded and the score tied in the bottom of the ninth to lift the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team to its fifth win of the season in a 9-8 victory against New Jersey City University Wednesday afternoon in Hoboken, N.J. The slugger of the day for the Ducks was senior first baseman **Dan Silva**, who batted 3-for-3, drove in a pair of runs and crossed the plate twice. Stevens battled back from an 8-6 deficit heading into the ninth as junior closer Joseph Tarallo blew the save having walked three batters, while not allowing a hit. With the win, Stevens improves to 5-7 on the year, as the Gothic Knights drop to 7-8-1.

* Sophomore third baseman **Ken Meerendonk** was named this week's Empire 8 Player of the week after he helped to guide the Ducks to a 3-0 showing as Stevens is riding a five-game win streak. Meerendonk hit .600 (6-for-10) with three runs scored, a double, two homeruns and four runs batted in during his outing. He also picked up the win in his seven innings pitched this past Saturday; having allowed just an earned run as he struck out five batters. This marks the first-time this season that a member from the Stevens baseball team has garnered Empire 8 weekly accolades. Meerendonk blasted his third homer of the season, a two-run shot in game one against Skidmore College to give the Ducks a three-run lead in the seventh, after they trailed by one heading into the inning. He also added a solo dinger in his first at-bat against the Thoroughbreds in Game 2. Meerendonk also batted 3-for-5 in a 9-8 victory against New Jersey City University.

Men's Lacrosse

Overall record4-3
 Empire 8 record1-0

* Stevens men's lacrosse went 1-1 last week, falling to No. 6 Endicott College, 11-9 and defeating Utica College, 12-4. Both games were in Hoboken, N.J.

* Men's lacrosse scored the game's final five goals, but it was not enough as the Ducks fell to No. 6 Endicott College, 11-9 on Wednesday night at the De Baun Athletic Complex. A dominant third quarter by the Gulls (5-0) extended a two-goal halftime lead to six, and the Ducks could never recover. Stevens (3-3) was led by three tallies from senior midfielder **Alex Heckman**, and two goals and an assist from seniors **Matt Keating** and **J.R. Oreskovich**. The Gulls were keyed by four goals from senior Nick Cosco (Londenderry, N.H.) and two scores and four assists from senior Brandon Dube (Danvers, Mass.).

* Dube scored 47 seconds into the fourth quarter to give Endicott its largest lead of the contest at 11-4, and it looked like the Gulls had taken all the life out of the Ducks. From that point on however, it was all Stevens as Keating started the rally with unassisted goal with 12:16 left. Sophomore midfielder **Chris Laurita** brought the Ducks to within five 47 ticks later, and Keating then put away a nice feed from Oreskovich with 9:48 left.

* Heckman and senior **Eric Smith** hooked up with 5:45 to go to make the score 11-8, and Heckman fired home a laser to pull the Ducks within two with 2:04 showing on the clock.

* Face-offs were a huge reason why the Gulls came out on top. They won 19-of-24 on the night and won several key ones late to secure the win.

* Stevens freshman **Vincent Crisco** won 17 of the 19 face-offs he took to help lift the Stevens men's lacrosse team to a 12-4 win over Utica College in the Empire 8 opener for both teams. Senior attackmen **Matt Keating** and **J.R. Oreskovich** led the offense, recording five points apiece as Stevens improves to 4-3 on the season. The Ducks outscored Utica 5-2 in the third quarter to give themselves some breathing room after a tight first half.

* Utica got a late goal in a relatively slow moving second quarter to cut the Stevens lead to two after two, and the Pioneers netted a quick score just 32 seconds into the third to make it a one-goal game. That second goal seemed to light a fire under the Ducks as Stevens erupted for four goals over the next 3:03 to open up a 7-2 advantage.

* Stevens returns to action on Tuesday night at 6 p.m. versus Colby College of New England Small College Athletic Conference. The Ducks return to conference play on March 28 at Alfred University.

Women's Lacrosse

* Women's lacrosse defeated No. 15 Amherst College 16-6 and Drew University 19-13 in a 2-0 week. The Ducks are ranked No. 15 in the country in the latest Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Top-20. Stevens is the only Empire 8 team in the poll.

* The win over Drew was the 100th in the history of the program and first for the Ducks in four tries.

* Stevens held Amherst scoreless in the final 37:26 of game time. 37:26!

* The Ducks have been dominant all season, scoring at least 16 goals in each game of 2009 and have outscored opponents 107-55. Another important statistic for Stevens is draw controls. The Ducks have won 103, compared to just 63 for opponents, giving them a huge advantage in possession.

* Leading the offense has been junior attack **Alyssa Pigott**. Pigott has 28 goals and seven assists. She has also picked up 18 ground balls, corralled 18 draws, and caused 13 turnovers. Sophomore attack **Leah Wasserman** has 21 goals, seven assists, and 17 ground balls, and fellow sophomore Karen Federico has tallied 14 goals and six helpers.

Sophomore midfielder **Christine Smith** the reigning Empire 8 Player of the Week, has been the most well-rounded player this season, scoring 22 times, recording three assists, picking up 19 ground balls, 31 draw controls, and causing 13 turnovers.

Sophomore **Kate Cox** has been a standout on defense, picking up team-highs in ground balls (22) and caused turnovers (19). Senior defender **Cassidy Callahan** has also been strong, scooping up 10 ground balls and controlling 14 draws.

Senior goalkeeper **Grace Sack** has been excellent in her first season as starter. She is 6-0 and has a save percentage .522. In last week's two wins, she made 28 saves and was named the Empire Goalie of the Week for her performances.

* Stevens returns to action on Saturday, March 28 at Utica College (12 p.m.) in the Empire 8 opener for the Ducks. They will then turn around and play Hartwick College on Sunday.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING

Overall record6-2

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's swimming program closed out an incredible 2009 season this past weekend on the Division III NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships in Minneapolis, Minn. The women's team sent seven swimmers all of them left as All-Americans or honorable mention All-Americans as the Ducks finished the four-day event 11th in the nation.

* Day 1 – Sophomore **Laura Barito** set a new school-record and finished seventh in the 50-yard freestyle, carding a time of 23.56. The 200-yard medley relay team also competed and finished in 11th. The team of freshman **Andrea Sturniolo**, junior **Stephanie Miller**, senior captain **Emily Woo**, and Barito turned in a 1:46.41. The finish earned the squad honorable mention All-American honors.

* Day 2 - The 200-yard freestyle relay team of freshmen **Hayley Hatfield** and **Cailin Grunewald**, Woo, and Barito won the consolation final with a school-record time of 1:35.15. They re-broke the school-mark they set earlier in the day in the prelims, and the team earned honorable mention All-America honors. The 400-yard medley relay team of Sturniolo, Miller, Woo, and Barito took 10th overall with a time of 3:53.02. The team took more than two seconds off its time in the prelims and beat the previous school-record by more than three seconds. The 10th-place finish also earned the team the honorable mention All-American distinction.

* Day 3 - Junior Stephanie Miller finished 31st in the 100-yard breaststroke and also set a new school-record with her time of 1:06.85. The relay team of Pearson, Grunewald, Woo, and Barito touched at 7:40.40 (school-record) to earn the 12th-place finish. The finish also netted the squad honorable mention All-America honors.

* Day 4 - The 400-yard freestyle relay team of freshmen Hayley Hatfield and Cailin Grunewald, senior captain Emily Woo, and Barito finished fourth in the prelims in a school-record time of 3:27.39. That group finished the final in 3:27.91 (sixth place) and is the first All-American relay team in program history. They took sixth place. Barito won the consolation swim in the 100-yard freestyle which netted her the ninth-place finish. She set a school-record with her time of 51.25.

* Overall – The team finished with 100.5 points, good for 11th overall and was the top finisher in the Empire 8. Barito was a two-time All-American as Hatfield, Grunewald, and Woo earned the distinction once each. The team also took home 13 honorable mention All-America accolades.

* Senior outside hitter **Joe Trinsey** led the team in kills (14) en route to a .440 hitting percentage on 25 swings with three errors to help lift the sixth-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team to its sixth league victory of the season in a 3-0 win against New Jersey City University Monday evening in Jersey City, N.J. The Ducks produced a .371 hitting percentage on the night and tallied eight team blocks as Head Coach **Patrick Dorywalski** claimed his 350th career win tonight, as coach of the men's program. With the win, Stevens improves to 18-6 overall and 6-1 in North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Metro division play.

* **Patrick Dorywalski** started the men's varsity program at Stevens in 1990 as he boasts a record of 350-195, which equates to a .642 win-loss percentage. He also pioneered the women's program from 1986 to 1999 to register a mark of 134-150-1. He currently has the most wins of any coach in the history of Stevens athletics with a total of 484.

* Senior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** hit .500 on the night as he landed 12 kills on 20 attempts. Cranford had three blocks in the win, while Trinsey had a pair to go with his seven defensive digs. Senior outside hitter **Tomas Bochicchio** totaled 11 kills to manufacture a .375 attacking rating off of 24 attempts and just two errors. He too led the team with seven digs and added three block assists.

* The National Collegiate Athletic Association recently publicized its eighth national ranking summary for the 2009 men's volleyball season, and for the seventh week in a row, Stevens Institute of Technology junior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** leads the nation in hitting percentage (.504) through 75 sets played. He is also 12th for blocks per set (1.20) and 40th for kills per set (3.25). Senior outside hitter **Joe Trinsey** is 26th for hitting percentage (.324), 25th for kills per set (3.76) and 15th in the country for blocks per set (1.13). Senior middle hitter **Doug Reger** has maintained the top spot for blocks per game having averaged 1.65 per set.
