Stevens Athletics Week in Review

March 31, 2009

Baseball

Overall record10-9
 Empire 8 record2-2

* The Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team went 3-2 on the week and had its six-game winning streak come to a close as the Ducks fell in Game 1 of a conference doubleheader against St. John Fisher College.

* Junior outfielder **Russ Grimes** went 4-for-7 with a run batted in and a pair of runs scored as Stevens split its conference doubleheader against St. John Fisher College Saturday afternoon in Hoboken, N.J. Sophomore infielder **Ken Meerendonk** batted 3-for-7 with three RBI and three runs scored, including a three-run homer to dead centerfield. The blast came in Game 2 as Stevens held a slight, 4-3 lead. His homerun was followed-up by a solo shot from Grimes, his third of the season. Meerendonk also posted his fourth win of the season having gone all seven innings.

* Junior outfielder **Russ Grimes** went 5-for-8 and tallied six runs batted in as Stevens once again split the doubleheader against Fisher on the second day of Empire 8 play. Grimes blasted a pair of homeruns, including a grand slam in Game 1 to help lift the Ducks to a 17-16 victory. But it was junior centerfielder **Mark Rasulo's** grand slam in the bottom of the seventh that gave the Ducks new life. Stevens fell in the nightcap 10-3, as a total of four grand slams were recorded on the day, en route to a total of 11 homers combined by both squads.

* Junior outfielder **Russ Grimes** was named this week's Empire 8 Co-Player of the week after he helped to guide the Ducks to a 3-2 showing. Grimes batted .529 (9-for-17) with seven runs scored, a double, three homeruns and seven runs batted in during his outing. This marks the second time this season that a member from the Stevens baseball team has garnered Empire 8 weekly accolades as sophomore infielder **Ken Meerendonk** landed conference accolades last week. On the year, Grimes is currently third on the team in hits (20), while he leads the Ducks with 19 RBI. Grimes is tied for second for runs scored (19), as he leads the squad along with Meerendonk and **Mark Rasulo** in homeruns (5).

Men's Lacrosse

Overall record6-3
 Empire 8 record2-0

* The Stevens men's lacrosse team earned two wins last week and is currently on a three-game winning streak.

* Sophomore goalkeeper Dave Decker made 18 saves and allowed just nine goals in 49:16 of action in the two Duck wins. He had a goals-against average of 4.94 and was named the Empire 8 Goalkeeper of the Week on Monday.

* Men's lacrosse held Colby College to just two second-half tallies in a 6-5 win over the Mules on Tuesday night at the De Baun Athletic Complex. Senior captain **Alex Heckman** scored the game-winner with 6:17 to go to lift the Ducks, as they were able to maintain possession for the final 4:25 of the fourth quarter after sophomore defender **Zach McHugh** intercepted a Colby pass. The win moved the Ducks to 5-3 overall and drops the Mules to 4-2.

* Stevens controlled the stat sheet, outshooting the Mules 44-23, winning the turnover battle 25-14, and picked up 31 ground balls compared to 23 for Colby. Neither team could capitalize on man-up chances as both teams were successful on more than 80 percent of their clears.

* The back three for the Ducks, sophomores **Tom Iadanza**, **Ted Pfeifer**, and **McHugh**, all played a huge role in the win. Iadanza caused two turnovers and picked up a ground ball but played shut-down defense all night. Pfeifer had four ground balls and a caused turnover, and McHugh caused four turnovers, had three ground balls, and gave Stevens its final, game-sealing possession when he skied to intercept a long Colby pass.

* Tied at four after the first half, the Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team erupted for nine goals in the third quarter to help secure a 13-5 conference victory over Alfred University on Saturday afternoon in Alfred, N.Y. Ten different players tallied goals as senior **J.R. Oreskovich**, sophomore **Brandon Faubert**, and junior **James Napolitano** all notched two goals apiece, and sophomores **Zach McHugh** and **Tom Iadanza** led the Stevens (6-3, 2-0 Empire 8) defense.

* The Ducks ended with a 46-32 advantage in shots taken and had a slight edge in ground balls (32-30). Stevens won the face-off battle, 12-8 and converted 23-of-26 of its clear attempts. Stevens had its best showing of the season on its man-up chances, converting on 66 percent (4-of-6), and once again, the defense was excellent on penalty kills. The Ducks held Alfred to just one goal in eight chances as the game featured 14 penalties.

* Stevens will take on host Hartwick College at 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday and St. John Fisher on Saturday at 3 p.m.

Women's Lacrosse

* Women's lacrosse rolled to two more wins this past week and are currently the No. 15 team in the country according to the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Top-20.

* Eight different players tallied goals and junior **Alyssa Pigott** and sophomore **Leah Wasserman** scored four times apiece as the No. 15 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team won its Empire 8 opener over Utica College, 17-8 on Saturday afternoon in Utica, N.Y. Stevens scored the final six goals of the first half to take a commanding 11-3 lead into the locker room as the outcome was never in question. WomensLacrosse.com Defensive Player of the Week **Grace Sack** was once again strong in goal, making five saves and moving to 7-0 on the season.

* Stevens controlled the action throughout, and it showed on the stat sheet. The Ducks took 41 shots and held Utica (3-3, 0-1 Empire 8) to just 16. Stevens also won 19-of-27 draw controls and had seven fewer turnovers than the Pioneers (27-20).

* Wasserman found net twice in 36 seconds to give Stevens a 4-1 lead. After the two teams traded goals, the Ducks ripped off the game's next six goals to expand a two-goal lead (5-3) to eight by the end of the half. Pigott, junior **Kara Borzillo**, Wasserman, sophomore **Pamela Loria**, and junior **Fionuala Quinn** all scored in the offensive explosion.

* Junior **Alyssa Pigott** recorded seven points, and sophomore **Christine Smith** scored five goals as the No. 15 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team was dominant in a 20-5 win at Hartwick College on Sunday afternoon in Oneonta, N.Y. Sophomore defender **Kate Cox** picked up a game-high 11 ground balls and caused five turnovers to pace the Stevens defense, and senior captain **Grace Sack** allowed just three goals in 50:17 of game time in goal. The win pushes the Ducks to 8-0 overall and 2-0 in the Empire 8.

* Emily Walsh got the Hawks on the board but would never get closer than 5-2 as the Ducks opened a 9-3 lead after 30 minutes of play. Walsh scored her third goal of the half with 11:30 remaining, and from that point, the Ducks went on to score 13-straight times, holding Hartwick scoreless for 32:56 when it was all said and done.

* Stevens will return to action this weekend with two home games at the De Baun Athletic Complex. The Ducks will host Ithaca College on Saturday at 12 p.m. and Elmira College Sunday at 1 p.m.

Men's Outdoor Track & Field

* Senior **Trevor Currie** became the first-ever Stevens Institute of Technology track and field athlete to provisionally qualify for the NCAA Division III Track and Field Championships as he cleared 4.70 meters (15'5") in the pole vault at the Dick Shea Invitational on Saturday at the United States Military Academy. The team set a total of three school records and qualified for the ECAC Championships in five events as the Ducks competed against other Division I, II, and III schools.

* Currie's vault was a new school-record in addition to qualifying for the ECAC's and NCAA's. He won the event by .30 meters, finishing ahead of athletes from Columbia University and Marist College.

* The 4x100 relay team finished sixth at the meet but the 44.45 time was good for ECAC qualifying. The squad was made up of freshman **Greg McLeod**, Currie, junior **John Sangiovanni**, and freshman **Doug Stewart**. The 4x400 relay team qualified for the ECAC's with a 3:25.68. Sophomore **Kevin Morgera**, freshman **Drew Ballinger**, freshman Sean Vasquez, and Currie combined for a second-place finish and turned in a 3:25.68. Currie turned in an anchor-leg time of 49.20.

* Morgera set a school-best and qualified for ECAC's with his 57.28 in the 400-meter hurdles and freshman **Sean Humphreys** re-broke the javelin record set last week by fellow freshman **Sebastian Luna**. He tossed the javelin 52.24 meters and beat his personal best by more than eight meters as both rookies have qualified for the ECAC's. Morgera bested the previous record by .001 in the 400-hurdles.

* Competing in the first decathlon of his career, freshman **Victor Servito** broke the previous school-record by more than 300 points. The rookie finished with 4,860 total points in the two-day event, and lastly, sophomore Bradford Antes finished the 3k steeplechase in 9:55.75. The time just missed the ECAC qualifying standard (1.5 seconds off) and was 48 seconds better than his previous personal-best.

* Currie was named the Empire Men's Track and Field Athlete of the Week for his performance at Army on Monday afternoon.

* Stevens will return to competitive action next weekend at Princeton University.
