Stevens Athletics Week in Review

April 7, 2009

Baseball

Overall record10-12
 Empire 8 record2-4

* The Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team brought its overall record below .500 as the Ducks went 0-3 on the week, including a pair of Empire 8 losses.

* Sophomore catcher **Denis Ackermann** went 2-for-3 with a pair of runs scored and two runs batted in as the Stevens team fell, 14-10 in a six-inning decision on Wednesday afternoon in Madison, N.J. Despite a six-run first-inning by Stevens, the weather was not on the Ducks side as the game was called due to rain. Stevens managed to post another five runs in the bottom of the fifth, however could not overcome the Rangers offensive prowess.

* Junior centerfielder **Mark Rasulo** started the game off with his first triple of the season. Freshman second baseman **Tom Phillips** followed it up with an infield single. Sophomore third baseman **Ken Meerendonk** was then struck by a pitch to load the bases for junior right fielder **Russ Grimes**. He came through with a two-run double to plate both Rasulo and Phillips. **Ackermann** then roped a single to drive in Meerendonk and Grimes as the Ducks took an early 4-0 lead. Sophomore infielder **Matt Glassman** doubled to put Ackermann on third as Stevens had a pair of men in scoring position. Senior first baseman **Dan Silva** singled to plate a pair of runs to extend the lead to six. The inning ended there after on a fly out, strikeout and ground out.

* Against Ithaca this past weekend, the Ducks totaled nine hits, four in the opener and five in game two. Senior lefty **Joe Finora** and sophomore **Ken Meerendonk** were the pitchers of record for Stevens and sophomore catcher **Denis Ackermann** went 2-for-3 in Game 2. Meerendonk drove in the only run of the day.

Men's Lacrosse

Overall record8-3
 Empire 8 record4-0

* The Stevens men's lacrosse team earned two wins last week and is currently on a five-game winning streak. The Ducks are in first place in the conference standings and are now 8-3 overall.

* The Ducks will hit the road for three-straight games starting on April 11 at Rochester Institute of Technology.

* Senior attackmen **Matt Keating** and **J.R. Oreskovich** recorded six and five points, respectively as the Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team defeated Hartwick College, 14-7 on a rainy Wednesday afternoon at the De Baun Athletic Complex in Hoboken, N.J. Freshman attackman **Alex Hofrichter** tallied a career-high three goals, and junior midfielder **Alex Couture** found net twice as the Ducks (7-3, 3-0 Empire 8) won for the fourth-straight game. Freshman **Vincent Crisco** won 16-of-22 face-offs to give the Ducks a big advantage in possession, and sophomore midfielder **Brandon Faubert** picked up a game-high 10 ground balls.

* The Ducks were able to blow open a relatively close game in the second half as they outscored the Hawks (3-5, 1-2 Empire 8) 7-2 in the game's final 30 minutes. Hartwick was hanging around, down 11-7 after three, but a penalty call against the Ducks seemed to elevate the squads' play in the fourth quarter as they really shut-down the Hawks. Stevens ended the contest with a 40-30 advantage in shots, but the Ducks put 26 on the cage. Stevens held a big advantage in ground balls (39-20) and face-offs (16-6).

* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team got a big win over St. John Fisher College, 8-7 on Saturday afternoon at the De Baun Athletic Complex in Hoboken, N.J. Senior attackman **Matt Keating** scored two goals as did freshman attackman Kevin Rose. The Cardinals netted the final three tallies of the contest, but freshman **Vincent Crisco** won the all-important final face-off to help seal the victory. Sophomore goalkeeper **Dave Decker** also played well for Stevens (8-3, 4-0 Empire 8), making 11 saves.

* The Stevens defense was solid throughout most of the game. Sophomores **Tom Iadanza**, **Zach McHugh**, and **Ted Pfeifer** led the way as **Jake Messimer** was strong as well. Iadanza had two caused turnovers and two ground balls, and McHugh accumulated four ground balls and three caused turnovers. Pfeifer had the best numbers for the defenders, scooping up five ground balls and causing three turnovers as Messimer had five ground balls and two caused turnovers.

* Stevens outshot Fisher 38-22 and held a slight edge in ground balls (30-29). Fisher won 10-of-16 face-offs but turned the ball over 23 times. Each squad converted two man-up chances as the Ducks were 2-for-4 and the Cardinals were 2-for-5.

Women's Lacrosse

Overall record10-0
 Empire 8 record4-0

* The Stevens women's lacrosse team went 2-0 this week and is now 10-0 on the year. The 10 wins in a row is a program-record.

* The Ducks are now the 11th ranked team in the country and are in first place in the conference standings.

* Junior **Alyssa Pigott** recorded her 200th career point and sophomore **Leah Wasserman** scored five times to lead the No. 13 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team to a huge, 16-14 Empire 8 win over Ithaca College on Saturday afternoon at the De Baun Athletic Complex in Hoboken, N.J. The win is the ninth in a row for the Ducks, a program record, as Stevens is now 3-0 in the conference. Eight different players scored goals in the win for Stevens and senior captain **Grace Sack** made 10 saves in goal. The entire 60 minutes was hotly contested as Stevens never relinquished the lead once it erased an early 1-0 deficit.

* Stevens tallied two of the first three goals in the second, but the Bombers answered with three straight scores over 11:43 of game time to knot the game at 12-all. With their backs against the walls, Stevens answered the Ithaca run with a three scores in a row over 3:21 to take a 15-12 lead. Pigott got two of the goals on free-position attempts and Wasserman netted the third. Ithaca was able to cut the lead to 15-13, but sophomore **Karen Federico** scored the final Duck goal of the contest with 3:31 left.

* After falling behind 1-0 less than one minute into the game, the No. 13 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team scored 14-straight goals en route to a 16-2 dismantling of Elmira College on Sunday afternoon at the De Baun Athletic Complex. Sophomores **Pamela Loria**, **Leah Wasserman**, and **Karen Federico** all tallied three goals as the Ducks won for a program-record 10th game in a row. The 14 consecutive scores came over a period of 43:53 and Elmira only totaled nine shots in the contest. The Ducks are now a perfect 10-0 overall and 4-0 in the Empire 8.

* Stevens controlled every aspect of the game. The Ducks ended with a 32-9 advantage in shots and a 27-16 edge in ground balls. Stevens won 13 draw controls compared to seven for Elmira (1-8, 0-3 Empire 8), and the Ducks converted 5-of-8 free-position shots.

* **Leah Wasserman** was named the Empire 8 Women's Lacrosse Player of the Work for her performance in the two Stevens wins.

* The Ducks will return to action on Wednesday night at 7 p.m. against Rowan University. The Ducks will then have two conference contests on April 18 and 19.

* Senior outside hitter **Joe Trinsey** was relentless on Sunday afternoon as he helped to lift the second-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team to a 3-1 win over No. 5 Nazareth College in the championship round of the 2009 North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Tournament. The Ducks have claimed their fourth NECVA title and have advanced to the 2009 Division III Molten National Championship, scheduled for April 17-18 in Mahwah, N.J. at Ramapo College. Trinsey landed 20 kills on 36 swings with just an error to produce a .528 hitting percentage. Senior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** was named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament as he launched four service aces and notched a .571 hitting percentage in the final match against the Golden Flyers. The energy the Ducks had was contagious as Trinsey fueled the fire with his emotions to send Stevens to its sixth NECVA appearance since the inaugural season of 1997.

* **Cranford** was awarded the NECVA player of the Year and was named to the All-NECVA team. He led the Ducks with 66 kills over the weekend and nine service aces. Cranford totaled 19 blocks and lofted 11 digs to be named the Most Valuable Player of the Tournament.

* **Trinsey** was selected as an All-NECVA second-teamer. He landed 66 kills and produced a .435 hitting percentage on the weekend. Trinsey had 11 total blocks and was named to the All-NECVA tournament team.

* **Bochicchio** drilled 61 kills, launched six aces and tallied 72.5 points on the weekend. He was named to the All-NECVA Tournament team for his performance.

* **Reger** led the team in blocks as he totaled 22 in 15 sets played. He accumulated a .319 hitting percentage off of 22 kills.

* Stevens will head to the Molten Tournament on April 17, hosted by Ramapo as the Ducks will face University of California-Santa Cruz. Stevens will look to claim its first-ever Molten title.
