## Stevens Athletics Week in Review

April 14, 2009

### Baseball

Overall record . . . . .11-15  
 Empire 8 record . . . . .3-7

\* Senior first baseman **Dan Silva** went 3-for-6 on the day with a pair of runs batted in as the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team split its doubleheader with Empire 8 foe, Rochester Institute of Technology on Friday afternoon in Rochester, N.Y. The Ducks led through six innings in Game 1 but gave up a two-out three-run pinch-hit walk-off homer in the bottom of the seventh to fall, 7-6. Silva drove in the first run of the nightcap, while sophomore **Ken Meerendonk** plated the eventual game-winning run to help the Ducks outlast the Tigers, 2-1.

\* The Ducks struck first in the nightcap as sophomore catcher **Denis Ackermann** reached base on a single to left field with one out. Sophomore infielder **Matt Glassman** singled to left field to put men on first and second as Silva stepped to the plate. He roped a single to centerfield to drive in Ackermann from second. The Ducks left the bases loaded as junior centerfielder **Mark Rasulo** ended the inning with a lineout to the pitcher.

\* After two scoreless innings, freshman second baseman **Tom Phillips** led off the top of the fifth with a single to right field. He then stole second base to put himself in scoring position as the No. 3 hitter, Meerendonk stepped to the plate and delivered a double to right center to plate Phillips for the go-ahead run. The Ducks once again stranded three on the pond, but it was all that Stevens needed as lights-out pitching helped to secure its 11th win of the year.

\* Sophomore pitcher **Dan Anunziatta** threw for six innings, allowed just six hits and did not render an earned run to claim his second win of the year (2-0). Sophomore pitcher **Kyle Hanas** came in to put the Tigers down in order and post his second save of the year.

\* Stevens dropped both games to RIT on Sunday and also fell in a rain-shortened game at Drew University earlier in the week. The Ducks went 1-4 last week.

# MEN'S GOLF

\* Sophomore **Aaron Dennis** carded an 80 to lead the Stevens Institute of Technology men's golf team to a second-place finish at Centenary College last Friday afternoon. Stevens finished with a team total of 336 as St. Joseph's College (Long Island) and Farmingdale State University tied for first with a 315. Centenary placed third with a group score of 351.

\* Senior **Tom Merriam** shot an 85 for the second-best score on the Ducks squad, while first-year golfer **George Greco** notched an 87. Sophomore John Kutcher followed up with a round total of 88.

\* Freshman **John Ziegler** carded an 84 on Monday afternoon as the Stevens produced a team total of 344 to be upended by Fairleigh Dickinson University-Florham, which shot a group count 314 at the Morris County Country Club (Par 71 – 6,249 Yards) in Morristown, N.J.

\* Stevens' next competition will be the Empire 8 Championship slated for this coming Saturday and Sunday at the Mark Twain Golf Club in Elmira, N.Y. Tee time for Saturday is scheduled for a 1 p.m. start. Last year, the Ducks finished fourth out of five with a team four-round total of 1,321. That mark established a new Stevens record.

## Men's Lacrosse

Overall record .....8-4  
 Empire 8 record .....4-1

\* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team gave up 11 second-half goals, and Rochester Institute of Technology was able to overcome an 8-3 halftime deficit to defeat the Ducks 14-11 on Saturday afternoon in Rochester, N.Y. The score was tied at nine after three quarters, but the Tigers netted five goals in the final 15 minutes to get the win. Senior attackman Matt Keating led Stevens with six points on three goals and three assists as the Ducks fall to 8-4 overall and 4-1 in the Empire 8.

\* The Ducks came out strong, scoring five of the game's first six goals. Sophomore midfielder **Brandon Faubert** tied the score at one 5:01 into the first and 4:14 later, senior captain **Alex Heckman** gave Stevens a 2-1 lead thanks to a feed from senior **Eric Smith**. Freshman **Kevin Rose** tallied goal three for Stevens, and Keating gave the Ducks a 4-1 edge 1:16 later with a man-up score. Freshman **Alex Hofrichter** found net 31 ticks after Keating to give the Ducks a 5-1 lead after one.

\* Senior **J.R. Oreskovich** gave the Ducks a six-goal lead with 11:11 to go in the third, but that would be the final Duck goal for the rest of the quarter. RIT was able to rip off six-straight scores over span of 4:42 of game time to knot the score at 9-all with 3:07 to go in the third. Six different players scored in the rally.

\* Hofrichter tallied 1:22 into the fourth quarter thanks to a Keating assist, but the Tigers (7-2, 2-2 Empire 8) got goals from David Burke (Fairport, N.Y.) and Adam Lehmann (Rochester, N.Y.) to take an 11-10 lead with 7:08 to play. Keating was able to tie the score with 5:12 left after a nice look from Heckman, but RIT took the lead for good with 3:37 to play after senior Billy Walton (Syracuse, N.Y.) scored for the first time on the afternoon. 17 seconds later, the Tigers went up two goals to seal the win. They also scored on an empty net with 2:12 left for the final margin.

\* Sophomore **Zach McHugh** led the Stevens defense with three caused turnovers and seven ground balls as **Jake Messimer** also picked up seven ground balls. Hofrichter, Heckman, Rose, and Keating all recorded multiple points in the loss.

Sophomore **Dave Decker** made a career-high 20 saves for Stevens and his counterpart, sophomore Robert Tonnessen (Ridgefield, Conn.), stopped 10 shots.

RIT ended the game with a slight edge in face-offs and finished with a 43-37 advantage in ground balls. The Ducks committed 35 turnovers compared to 29 for the Tigers who also converted four man-up chances into tallies. Each team struggled on clears, with the Ducks converting 16-of-24 and RIT 20-of-26. The Tigers also ended with a 50-38 advantage in shots.

\* The Ducks will look to get back in the win column when they visit Nazareth College on April 19 at 12 p.m.

**Women's Lacrosse**

Overall record .....11-0  
 Empire 8 record .....4-0

\* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team won again in its one game last week to move to 11-0. The Ducks are currently No. 11 in the nation and are the only team in the IWLCAs Top-20 that is unbeaten.

\* Sophomore midfielder **Christine Smith** found net five times and recorded the 100th point of her career, and senior defender **Cassidy Callahan** had a huge all-around game as the No. 11 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team moved to 11-0 on the season with a 14-8 win over Rowan University on Wednesday night at the De Baun Athletic Complex. Stevens scored five of the game's first seven goals to take a 5-2 lead, and Rowan (5-5) never got closer than three the rest of the way.

\* Once again, Stevens controlled the stat sheet, outshooting the Profs 37-19 and picking up 21 ground balls compared to 15 for Rowan. The Ducks took 15-of-24 draws and turned the ball over just 13 times.

\* The game had an enormous number of fouls called as both teams were visibly bothered at times. The Ducks were whistled for 37 fouls and Rowan 21 as the officials really had an impact on the flow of the game.

\* Sophomore **Karen Federico** got the Ducks rolling with a goal just 42 seconds into the action. Smith followed with her first tally 7:06 later, and sophomore **Pamela Loria** netted goal number three.

\* Federico and sophomore **Leah Wasserman** scored 43 seconds apart after Rowan got on the board to build a 5-1 lead, and it was no looking back for the Ducks. The two teams went back and forth from the 10-minute mark of the first half, but Stevens was able to push the lead to 9-5 after the first 30 minutes. Smith scored goals six, seven and nine and Federico put away Stevens' eighth.

\* The Profs were able to slice into the Stevens lead 4:36 into the second, but junior **Alyssa Pigott** and Wasserman hooked up for a pretty goal a little less than nine minutes later to essentially seal the win.

\* Senior goalkeeper **Grace Sack** made eight saves and got her 11th win of the season in goal for Stevens. Her counterpart, Alicia Mannino (Richboro, Pa.), was excellent, making 18 saves for the Profs.

\* Pigott finished with three goals, four ground balls, and two caused turnovers. Sophomore defender **Kate Cox** caused four turnovers and picked up three ground balls in addition to corraling one draw. Federico also had three goals for the Ducks, and Wasserman tallied twice, had two assists, two ground balls and a draw control.

\* Smith ended the contest with five goals on just seven shots, two ground balls, and three draw controls. Callahan was all over the field the entire night, scooping up three ground balls, getting to five draws, and causing four Rowan turnovers.

\* Stevens will return to the field on April 18 when it hosts St. John Fisher College in a key Empire 8 game. First draw is scheduled for 1p.m. at the De Baun Athletic Complex.
