## Stevens Athletics Week in Review

April 21, 2009

### Baseball

Overall record . . . . .12-17  
 Empire 8 record . . . . .3-7

\* The Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team went 2-1 on the week including a 4-0 loss to The College of New Jersey earlier today.

\* Sophomore pitcher **Dan Anunziatta** went six and one-third innings pitched, did not render an earned run and allowed just four hits as the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team was held to five hits on the day in its 4-0 loss to the College of New Jersey Tuesday evening in Ewing, N.J. Freshman pitcher Mike Fallon threw 7.1 innings for the Lions, gave up just five hits in 31 batters faced to earn his first collegiate win. Senior first baseman **Dan Silva** and junior right fielder **Russ Grimes** were responsible for four of the five hits produced by the Ducks as they each tallied two on the day. With the loss, Stevens drops to 12-17, while TCNJ improves to 20-13-1 overall.

\* Anunziatta held the Lions scoreless entering the sixth. TCNJ broke through in the bottom of the sixth as freshman infielder James Ruzich walked followed by a base hit off the bat of senior third baseman Vince Mazzacarro base hit to right-center. It was then junior outfielder Chris Esperon who laid down a sacrifice bunt to advance the runners to second and third before junior infielder Ryan Anzelone reached on an error to load the bases. The Lions called upon sophomore second baseman Gary Fare to pitch-hit as he ended the deadlock by plating Ruzich off a fielder's choice. The Ducks then mishandled a pick-off allowing Mazzacarro to score extending the Lions lead to 2-0.

\* Junior lefty **Joe Finora** threw for six innings, struck out 13 batters and rendered just a pair of hits to help lift the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team to its 12th win of the year in a 10-0 shutout of Lehman College Wednesday night in Hoboken, N.J. The Ducks totaled seven hits on the day as sophomore catcher **Denis Ackermann** batted 2-for-3 with two runs batted in and scored once for the Ducks.

# MEN'S GOLF

\* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's golf team repeated as fourth-place finishers at this year's Empire 8 Championship held in Elmira, N.Y.

\* Senior **Tom Merriam** carded an 81 at the third round of the Empire 8 Championship Saturday morning as Stevens has maintained the fourth spot with a team total of 1,021. The final two rounds of the championship are being played at the Mark Twain Golf Club (Par 72 – 6,857) in Elmira, N.Y. From an individual standpoint, Merriam is currently fourth among the field with a three-round total of 233. St. John Fisher College still led the pack with its group count of 934.

\* Senior **Scott Mozeleski** posted a Stevens low-round total of 88 at the final round of the Empire 8 Championship Sunday morning as the Ducks finished fourth with a team total of 1,380. From an individual standpoint, senior **Tom Merriam** concluded the tournament having finished in fifth place among the field with a four-round total of 322. Mozeleski finished close behind in 12th and a four-round total of 350. St. John Fisher College repeated as this year's champion having produced a four-round team total of 1,271.

\* The Empire 8 recently announced the 2008-09 Men's Golf All-Conference Team as senior **Tom Merriam** of Stevens earned first-team accolades. Merriam, who recorded second-team honors for the past two years, entered the spring portion of the league tournament in the second slot. He finished fifth overall with his four-round total of 322. Senior **Scott Mozeleski** was chosen to receive this season's Sportsman of the Year Award.

\* Merriam's best performance this season came during Round 2 of the Empire 8 Championship where he carded a one-under par 71. He opened the tournament with a first-round score of 81. Merriam closed out the spring portion having produced a two-day total of 170. He also helped the Ducks to a second-place finish at the Centenary College Invite this year.

**Men's Lacrosse**

Overall record .....9-4  
 Empire 8 record .....5-1

\* Stevens went 1-0 last week and has clinched a spot in the Empire 8 Championship. The Ducks can finish anywhere from first to fourth in the conference standings depending on the last two conference regular-season games this week.

\* Seniors **J.R. Oreskovich** and **Eric Smith** each totaled four points as the Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team went on the road and earned a big 20-10 win over Empire 8 foe Nazareth College on Sunday afternoon in Rochester, N.Y. Stevens built a 7-2 lead after the first 15 minutes and ended the first half up by 10 goals (13-3) as Nazareth never threatened the rest of the way. With the win, Stevens clinches a spot in the Empire 8 Men's Lacrosse Championship and improves to 9-4 overall and 5-1 in the conference.

\* Knowing they could clinch a spot in the conference tournament with a win, the Ducks came out on fire. Smith tallied 52 seconds in and one minute later sophomore **Jake Messimer** put Stevens on top 2-0. Smith and Oreskovich scored back-to-back goals for a 4-0 lead with 7:57 left in the first, and after the first Golden Flyer goal, sophomore midfielder **Brandon Faubert** and Smith scored 64 seconds apart to make it a 6-1 game.

\* The first quarter ended with the score at 7-2, and the Ducks did not let up one bit in the second. Stevens tacked on four goals over a 4:19 span to build an 11-2 lead as senior attackman Matt Keating, senior midfielder **Alex Heckman**, and Oreskovich accounted for tallies.

\* Unlike the loss at Rochester Institute of Technology eight days prior, Stevens came out with great intensity in the second half and continued to extend its lead. The Ducks poured in four of the first five goals in the third quarter to build an insurmountable 17-4 lead with 22:40 left to play.

\* Sophomore **Dave Decker** got the win in goal for the Ducks, making 15 saves and scooping up a ground ball. Faubert ended with a goal, an assist, six ground balls, and two caused turnovers. Senior **Matt Keating** found net twice and added an assist, and Oreskovich notched three goals, one assist, and five ground balls. Hofrichter tallied three times and Messimer had a goal and two assists along with four ground balls as sophomores **Tom Iadanza** and **Ted Pfeifer** paced the Stevens defense with six and four ground balls, respectively. Smith finished with four goals on eight shots for the Ducks, and Heckman found the back of the net twice.

\* Stevens will visit Elmira College on April 22 before closing out the regular season at home against No. 4 Ithaca College on April 25. The game with Ithaca will have huge conference playoff implications, and it will serve as the celebration of 125 years of lacrosse at Stevens.

\* With his final point in the contest, Oreskovich moved into sole possession of the top spot in the Stevens men's lacrosse record book in career points. He currently has one more point (228) than previous record-holder Mark Bielicky '07.

**Women's Lacrosse**

Overall record .....13-0  
 Empire 8 record .....6-0

\* Stevens won two games last week and is now 13-0 overall and 6-0 in the Empire 8. With the two wins, the Ducks somehow **dropped** one spot in the IWLCA Top-20. They went from No. 11 to No. 12 and are the only undefeated team in the country.

\* For the third time this season, junior **Alyssa Pigott** was named the Empire 8 Women's Lacrosse Player of the Week. Pigott scored 11 goals in the two Ducks wins.

\* **Alyssa Pigott** scored five goals and sophomore **Leah Wasserman** totaled five points as the then-No. 11 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team moved to 12-0 on the season with a 17-14 win over St. John Fisher College on Saturday afternoon at the De Baun Athletic Complex. Sophomore **Pamela Loria** also played an excellent game, tallying three goals and assisting on another, and senior **Grace Sack** got her 12th win of the season in goal.

\* The Ducks finished the contest with a 48-27 advantage in shots and picked up five more ground balls than the Cardinals (22-17). The Ducks, who are now 5-0 in the conference, won 21 of the 33 draws and were 4-of-9 on free-position attempts. Sack made nine saves in goal for Stevens, and her counterpart Vicki Sahn (Baldwinsville, N.Y.) was solid, stopping 23 shots.

\* In addition to her five goals, Pigott had four ground balls and a team-high five draw controls, and sophomore midfielder **Christine Smith** had a goal, dished out three assists, and notched four draw controls. Wasserman ended the game with three scores and two assists, three draw controls, and a ground ball. Freshman **Jenna Scheibling** tallied twice for Stevens as sophomore **Karen Federico**, freshman **Ashley Carey**, and junior **Kara Borzillo** all scored once. The Stevens defense was led by senior **Cassidy Callahan** who had three draw controls and three ground balls.

\* **Alyssa Pigott** recorded seven points on six goals and an assist and sophomore **Karen Federico** netted four goals as Stevens pushed its record to 13-0 with a 16-7 win over Nazareth College on Sunday. Stevens started the game on fire, taking an 8-0 lead 15:54 into the game and the Golden Flyers never got closer than six the rest of the way. With the win, Stevens remains in first place in the Empire 8 standings with a record of 6-0.

\* Federico scored the first goal of the game on a free-position shot 6:12 into the action and Pigott followed with a pair of tallies at 23:05 and 22:34 to give Stevens a 3-0 lead. Sophomore defender **Kate Cox** scored the fourth goal of the game after taking it coast-to-coast. Pigott notched her third thanks to a nice feed from sophomore **Pamela Loria**, and Federico and freshman **Ashley Carey** recorded goals number six and seven 1:36 apart. The final tally of the great start came from the stick of Federico.

\* Prior to the game Stevens honored its seniors (Sack, **Ali Palen**, Callahan, and **Jean Matusiak**).

\* The Ducks will take on Rochester Institute of Technology on Saturday in a game to decide who will host the conference tournament. Stevens will visit Alfred University on Sunday.

## Men's Outdoor Track & Field

\* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's outdoor track and field team took third of five at the 2009 Empire 8 Championships this past weekend at Nazareth College in Rochester, N.Y. The Ducks totaled 76 team points as Ithaca College repeated as conference champions with a team total of 222. Rochester Institute of Technology finished a close second with 186 points, and Alfred University was fourth and Nazareth was fifth.

\* Senior **Trevor Currie** had a big weekend for Stevens, winning the pole vault and taking third in the 100-meter dash. He cleared 4.60 meters (15'1") in the vault and carded an 11.41 in the 100. His two top-five finishes netted the team 16 points, and he earned first-team all-conference honors in the pole vault.

\* Freshman **Sean Vasquez** earned eight points and second-team All-Empire 8 distinction with his second-place finish in the 800-meter run. He crossed the tape at 1:57.08. Sophomore **Kevin Morgera** qualified for the ECAC's with his second-place finish in the 400-meter hurdles. He turned in a 56.47 which was also a new school-record.

Sophomore **Nick Lowe** also had a solid weekend. He earned second-team all-conference honors by taking second in the long jump (6.44 meters (21'1")). He also carded a fourth-place finish in the triple jump. He totaled 12.66 meters (41'6") and recorded 12 team points in all.

\* The 4x100 relay squad took third place and qualified for the ECAC's. The team of Lowe, Currie, junior **John Sangiovanni**, and rookie **Greg McLeod** carded a 43.75 which was also good for a school-record.

\* The 4x400 relay of Morgera, freshman **Drew Ballinger**, Vasquez, and Currie also took third and qualified for ECAC's. Their time of 3:24.02 was a school-record as well. Freshmen **Sean Humphreys** and **Sebastian Luna Jr.** took third and fourth, respectively, in the javelin, and senior **Alex Bachowski** improved his personal-best by eight meters in the hammer throw, tossing it 41.93 meters (137'7"). The throw was good for fourth place.

Sophomore **Bradford Antes** took fourth place in the steeple chase with a 10:03.22 and Sangiovanni was sixth in the 100-meter dash. Freshman **Victor Servito** was recorded a sixth-place finish in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 16.53.

The Ducks will return to action on April 23 and 24 at the Penn Relays.

# MEN'S VOLLEYBALL

\* The second-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team made history Friday evening in Mahwah, N.J. as the Ducks claimed their first-ever semifinal win at the Molten Division III Volleyball Championship. However, Stevens fell in the Finals to No. 1 Juniata College.

\* Senior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** helped to propel the squad to its first-ever national title match appearance after the Ducks upended the University of California-Santa Cruz in the semifinal of the 2009 Division III Molten Volleyball Championship Friday night in Mahwah, N.J. The 3-0 victory marks the first time in the Duck's sixth trip to the Molten Tournament that the squad has advanced to the final match. Recently named the American Volleyball Coaches Association National Player of the Year, Cranford produced a .429 hitting percentage with 11 kills on 21 swings and tallied six total blocks.

\* Arguably one of the most exciting sets played by the Ducks where they were able to fight back against a very talented opponent came in Set 3 of the win. Teams traded points in the early going before Santa Cruz went ahead 10-8. The Banana Slugs then maintained at least a two-point lead until the Ducks knotted the game at 17-all. Stevens went ahead off an ace from **Reger**, however a service error and attacking error by Stevens swung the set back in favor of the Banana Slugs. Stevens hung tough to come back and tie the set at 25-25. An attack error by UC, followed up with a kill from **Bochicchio** gave the Ducks a two point advantage. Two-consecutive side-outs by Stevens allowed Santa Cruz to stay in the match. It was then tied at 28 and 29 before Cranford landed a kill, and an attack by the Banana Slugs went wide of the court to have Stevens win Set 3, 31-29. Cranford led the way with five kills and two blocks. **Trinsey** and **PremDas** each had three kills in the win. **Grobeis** dished out 12 assists, while **Bochicchio** had four kills.

\* **Andrew Cranford** manufactured a .389 hitting percentage off of 9 kills on 18 swings as Stevens fell in a hard-fought three-set battle to No. 1 Juniata College in the 2009 Molten Division III Volleyball Championship held at Ramapo College in Mahwah, N.J. In the Ducks first trip to the finals of the Molten, Stevens fell by the scores of 30-26, 30-25 and 30-19. Stevens was limited to just eight team blocks and a service ace on the night; two areas that have led to the Ducks success up to this point. The seven seniors that walk away from the match have much to be proud of having led the Ducks to a 26-7 overall mark and first-ever chance at a national title.
