Stevens Athletics Week in Review

April 28, 2009

Baseball

* The Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team has been on a hot streak having won its last five games to go above the .500 mark. The Ducks went 5-1 on the week including a four-game sweep of Empire 8 foe Utica College.

* For the third time this season, a member of the Stevens baseball team was awarded Empire 8 Player of the Week accolades as junior left fielder **Anthony Andrews** landed the honor after he helped the Ducks to a 5-1 week. Andrews hit .467 (7-for-15) with seven runs scored, a double, nine runs batted in and two homers; his first pair of the season. In the weekend sweep of conference foe Utica College, he finished 5-for-10 with six runs scored.

Andrews started the week off having driven in four runs during the Ducks 7-4 win against Vassar College last Wednesday. In the sixth inning of that game, Andrews notched his first homerun of the season, a two-run shot to deep left field to give the Ducks a 7-2 cushion. In the final contest of the weekend doubleheaders against the Pioneers, Andrews jacked his second homer of the year, a three-run shot to break a 2-2 stalemate as the Ducks went on to win 10-2.

* Senior second baseman **Matt Girnys** went 1-for 2 on the day with three runs batted in and a pair of runs scored as the Ducks brought its season record back to .500 (17-17) after Stevens closed out the weekend sweep (4-0) of Utica College taking two away from the Pioneers on Senior Day. The Ducks won Game 1, 16-15 in the bottom of the seventh off the bat sophomore catcher **Denis Ackermann**. Girnys came through with a two-out two-run double in the first game to put Stevens up by two (9-7) in the bottom of the fifth. The Ducks came out on top in the nightcap. Senior first baseman **Dan Silva** batted 2-for-6 with five runs scored for the Ducks.

* Stevens Hall of Famer William Downey was on hand this past Saturday and threw out the first pitch. Downey, who was offered a contract to go into organized baseball early in his college career was one of the most versatile athletes in the history of Stevens Athletics. Having earned nine varsity letters in three different sports, Downey was inducted into the Stevens Hall of Fame in 1997.

Men's Lacrosse

Overall record10-5
 Empire 8 record6-2

* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team went 1-1 last week and finished the regular season with a record of 10-5 overall and 6-2 in the Empire 8.

* Stevens jumped back into the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association Top-20 for the first time since March 16. The Ducks are currently No. 20.

* With a huge game versus fourth-ranked Ithaca College looming on Saturday night, the Stevens Institute of Technology took care of what it needed to and defeated Elmira College, 25-10 on Wednesday afternoon in Elmira, N.Y. Stevens scored 20 goals for the second-straight game and won for the sixth time in seven tries to push their record to 10-4 overall and 6-1 in the Empire 8. The win set the stage for an enormous season finale.

* Stevens dominated the game from start to finish, ending with a 62-31 advantage in shots, and picking up 51 ground balls compared to 43 for the Soaring Eagles. Elmira (1-11, 0-7 Empire 8) won 20-of-33 face-offs but converted just 15-of-26 clear attempts. Stevens turned the ball over just seven times and was successful on 21-of-25 clear attempts.

* Senior **Burke Reynolds** made his first start of the season in goal, getting the win and making seven saves in 50 minutes. Reynolds allowed just one goal.

* Men's lacrosse jumped out to an early 3-0 lead, but the fourth-ranked Ithaca College Bombers scored seven of the next nine goals en route to a thrilling 11-10 victory on Saturday night in front of a huge crowd at the De Baun Athletic Complex. Stevens will now move on to the Empire 8 Championship semifinals on Friday afternoon. Stevens, the second seed in the four-team tournament, will host third-seeded St. John Fisher College at 4 p.m. in Hoboken.

* The Ducks started the game on fire, tallying three goals in the first 3:15 of game time

* **Dave Decker** was strong in goal, making a career-high 22 saves in the loss. His counterpart, sophomore David Gal (Amherst, Mass.), also played well, stopping 15 shots.

* **Alex Hofrichter** and **Matt Keating** finished with three goals apiece and **J.R. Oreskovich** had four points on a goal and three assists. Sophomore **Brandon Faubert** won 7-of-11 face-offs and picked up a game-high eight ground balls. Sophomore **Zach McHugh** caused four turnovers, and scooped up three ground balls, and sophomore **Ted Pfeifer** picked up two ground balls in addition to causing four turnovers. Both Couture and Smith finished with a goal and an assist.

Women's Lacrosse

* Stevens is No. 12 in the country and still the only undefeated team in the nation after two more conference wins this past weekend.

* The Ducks have one more game in the regular-season remaining before hosting the Empire 8 Tournament on Saturday and Sunday. They will take on No. 4 The College of New Jersey on Tuesday night at 7 p.m. in Ewing, N.J. Stevens will host St. John Fisher College in the first semifinal on Saturday at 12 p.m. Rochester Institute of Technology and Nazareth College will immediately follow with the two winners playing on Sunday at 12 p.m.

* **Grace Sack** was named the Empire 8 Goalkeeper of the Week after making 21 saves in the two Stevens wins. She allowed just 15 goals.

* Junior **Alyssa Pigott** scored five goals and senior **Grace Sack** was excellent in net as the 12th-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team was able to erase a 5-2 halftime deficit en route to an 11-8 win over Rochester Institute of Technology on Saturday afternoon in Rochester, N.Y. The win pushed the Ducks' record to 14-0 overall and 7-0 in the Empire 8.

* The Stevens defense was strong all day. Sack made 14 saves on the afternoon, her second high total this season. Junior **Sam Zucker** caused a team-high three turnovers and **Kate Cox** caused two in addition to picking up four ground balls. Senior **Cassidy Callahan** did a nice job RIT standout Eileen Hennigan (Liverpool, N.Y.) and picked up four ground balls.

* **Leah Wasserman** finished the contest with three points on two goals and assist as the sophomore also had two ground balls and two draw controls. **Pamela Loria** had four points on one goal and three assists. She also had two ground balls, three draw controls, and a caused turnover. Stevens also got strong performances from freshmen **Jenna Scheibling** and **Ashley Carey**.

* Sophomore **Pamela Loria** scored five times and senior goalkeeper **Grace Sack** made seven saves to help lift the No. 12 Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team to a 17-7 win over Empire 8 foe Alfred University on Sunday afternoon in Alfred, N.Y. The win moved the Ducks to 15-0 on the season and completed a perfect conference regular season (8-0).

* Stevens took the lead early and never gave it up as junior **Alyssa Pigott** tallied 1:33 into the game. Loria got her first assist from sophomore midfielder **Christine Smith** for a 2-0 lead, and after a Saxon goal, the Ducks ripped off three straight to take a commanding 5-1 lead with 11:09 left in the first. Smith, freshman **Jenna Scheibling**, and Loria had the goals in the run.

* Junior **Katie Lalli** notched a goal 40 seconds into the second half to ignite a 7-0 Stevens run that put the game away.

Men's Outdoor Track & Field

* On Saturday at the Lion Invitational in Ewing, N.J., the Stevens Institute of Technology men's track and field braved very warm weather and got several strong individual performances in the process. Three athletes turned in personal-best marks as the team nears competition at the 2009 Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships.

* Senior **Matt Caulfield's** personal-best came in the 5000-meter run, breaking the tape at 17:19.15. His time was good for 21st overall. Freshman **Greg McLeod** broke 24 seconds for the first time all season in the 200-meter dash, turning in a 23.98 and taking 30th overall. Senior Alex Bachowski placed eighth in the hammer throw and turned in a personal best by more than 15 feet. He turned in a toss of 43.57 meters.

* Freshman **Sebastian Luna** was 10th in the javelin (51.60 meters), and **Nicholas Lowe** was eighth in the long jump (6.39 meters). **Patrick Cuning** cleared 1.80 meters in the high jump and took fifth-place overall, and **Kevin Morgera** was sixth in the 400-meter hurdles (57.41).

* Stevens will take a week off to get healthy before the New Balance Invitational at Randall's Island which will be the last chance for athletes to qualify for the ECAC Championships.
