Stevens Athletics Week in Review

February 24, 2009

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Overall record13-12
 Empire 8 record6-10

* Stevens men's basketball went 1-1 on the road this past weekend and finishes the regular season with a record of 13-10. The Ducks were 6-10 in the conference.

* Senior guard **Anthony Passalacqua** was named the Empire 8 Player of the Week for the second time this season on Monday evening and was also named the Metropolitan Writers Basketball Association Weekly Honor Roll for his performance last weekend. Passalacqua had a huge two games for the Stevens Institute of Technology men's basketball team, averaging over 30 points and hitting 17 three-point field goals. In a win over Elmira College, the Staten Island, N.Y. native scored 39 points and hit a Stevens-record 10 three-pointers. Passalacqua was 11-for-21 from the floor in 33 minutes of action and hit 10 of the 17 threes he attempted. He also had three steals. In addition, Passalacqua was named the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Division III Upstate Player of the Week on Tuesday evening. In a 67-60 loss at Hartwick, the tri-captain hit seven more from long range, scored 24 points and again had three steals. He finished the week averaging 31.5 points on 57.6 percent shooting. He shot 61 percent from behind the arc and was 8-for-9 from the line. Passalacqua completes the regular season averaging 16 points per game and shooting 44.1 percent from three-point range. In his last six games, he averaged almost 21 points on 54.7 percent from the floor.

* In the Elmira win, senior guard **Virgil Gray** had 19 points and five rebounds, and sophomore forward **Bryan Franklin** scored a season-high 10 points for the Ducks.

* Freshman forward **Simon Smith** was solid for the Ducks, netting eight points and pulling down 10 rebounds. The Ducks hit 20 of their 27 attempts from the line and won the battle of the boards, 43-35.

* In the Hartwick loss, Passalacqua finished with 24 points and junior guard **Matt Higgins** finished with 15 points and 11 rebounds.

* Stevens will now await its fate in regards to the ECAC Tournament. The Ducks are eligible and will find out if they qualify early next week.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Overall record20-5
 Empire 8 record12-4

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's basketball team concluded regular-season play with a pair of Empire 8 wins over Elmira College and Hartwick College. The Ducks have earned the three seed heading into this weekend's conference championship.

* Senior point guard **Dani Dudek** has made quite the name for herself in her final season in Duck uniform. Dudek, who has been featured in a pair of local newspapers and the well-known collegiate basketball site d3hoops.com, stands with Division I legend Nancy Leiberman as the only set of players to have recorded 1,000+ points, 800+ rebounds and 600+ assists in their careers. Dudek has accumulated 1,240 points, 810 boards and 660 assists.

* For the first time this season, freshman guard **Melissa Collier** earned Empire 8 Rookie of the Week accolades. Collier posted a team-high 20 points in the win over Elmira Friday night. She was nine of 11 shooting, pulled in four boards and dished out three assists to help defeat the Soaring Eagles.

* Sophomore center **Paige Armstrong** posted a season-high 18 points and pulled in eight boards as the Ducks closed out its regular season with a victory over Hartwick.

* Junior forward **Brittany Fuller** buried four threes en route to 16 points against the Hawks as the Ducks improve to 20-5 on the year and 12-4 in Empire 8 play.

* Freshman forward **Jillian Barrett** had a season-high 16 points and pulled in three boards against the Soaring Eagles. Senior point guard **Dani Dudek** notched 13 points, nine assists and eight total rebounds for Stevens.

* Stevens will take on Utica College in the semifinals of the Empire 8 Championship. The Ducks have defeated the Pioneers twice during regular season play, including a convincing 71-58 victory on Utica's home floor. Stevens fell to the Pioneers in the finals of the league championship a year ago as the Ducks dream of reaching their first NCAA tournament was quickly wiped away.

* The Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team earned its first win of the young 2009 season as the Ducks defeated the Bloodhounds of John Jay College, 12-7. Stevens also played a nine inning contest against No. 4 Kean University, as they fell by a close 4-3 decision.

* Freshman second baseman **Tom Phillips** drove in a pair of runs and notched two hits as Stevens dropped its third game of the season to fourth-ranked Kean Saturday afternoon in Ewing, N.J.

* In the top of the six, the Ducks made it a one-score game after junior outfielder **Russ Grimes** started the inning off with a single through the left side. The following batter, senior infielder **Dan Silva** reached base on a fielder's choice. Junior outfielder **Anthony Andrews** moved the runners into scoring position after he laid down a nice sacrifice bunt towards the right side. It was then Phillips, who singled through the left side as Silva came in to score, followed by Grimes. The inning ended with a pop out to short as Stevens left one on base. Stevens was able to record one more run in the top of the eight off the bat of Andrews to plate Grimes, however the Ducks came up just short as they fell 4-3 to the nationally ranked Cougars.

* Sophomore third baseman **Ken Meerendonk** went 5-for-5 with an RBI and a run scored to help Stevens record its first win of the season over John Jay College, 12-7. Junior center-fielder **Mark Rasulo** was 3-for-4 on the day with five RBI's, including a homerun to left centerfield. The Ducks tallied 12 hits in the victory as junior lefty **Joe Finora** earned the win for his six innings of work. Finora (1-1) struck out eight batters and rendered just two earned runs and gave up a pair of walks.

* Junior pitcher **Bill Jennings** came in to close out the top of the ninth after he sat down a pair of batters on strikes.

* The Ducks will return to action next Sunday as they host Mount St. Mary College at noon at the Dobbelaar Baseball Field in Hoboken, N.J. The game will feature the second live webcast to ever be produced for baseball at www.empire8.tv.

MEN'S FENCING

Overall record14-10

* Freshmen **Dzimitry Lamianski** and **Charles Steiner** of the Stevens Institute of Technology men's fencing team struck gold as both fencers earned championships in their respected weapons at the Middle Atlantic Conference Fencing Association (MACFA) championships Sunday afternoon in Easton, Pa.

* **Lamianski**, a sabriest, went undefeated in the preliminary rounds to post a perfect 16-0 mark. Going into the final ranked No. 1, he proceeded to plow thru to the field and in the championship bout defeated UNC's Kevin Zeichman 15-12 for the gold.

* In epee, **Steiner** also entered the final ranked No. 1 with a 12-4 record and was joined by freshman teammates **Keeth Vandingstee**, ranked fourth and junior **Steven DiPaola** ranked eighth. Steiner unfortunately had to eliminate teammates DiPaola and Vandingstee en route to the final bout, but made up for it by defeating UNC's Eric Hsieh in a thrilling overtime championship match, 13-12 with less than 30 seconds left. Vandingstee would finish third and DiPaola finished eighth. Senior foilist **Ben Hochberg** finished seventh at the foil championship.

* The day was capped off with a remarkable act of sportsmanship as UNC relinquished their MACFA Sabre Team Championship trophy, plaque and medals to the Stevens sabre squad after UNC's sabre team was informed by their coach Ron Miller that a conference referee recorded a defeat for Stevens' fencer when it should have been a victory. The margin of victory was one bout, as the Ducks win total was recorded as 42, when in actuality the team had won 43 contests. UNC was the overall MACFA champion, Stevens finished second and defeated conference rivals Drew University 7-2 and third place finisher Johns Hopkins University 9-0. Stevens also finished second in both the foil and epee team competitions. A total of 17 schools and 102 athletes competed at the conference championships.

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's fencing team hosted the 3rd annual Eastern Collegiate Women's Fencing Conference Individual Championships and the 12 annual Stevens Invite Sunday afternoon in Hoboken, N.J. The Ducks had a stellar outing as six fencers earned all-conference honors. In addition, Stevens had eight other fencers take home medals as they competed in the "substitute pool" of the Stevens Invitational.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING

Overall record6-2

* In order to get the idea of the amazing job the Stevens women's swimming team did at the NYSWCAA/Empire 8 Championships visit StevensDucks.com and look at the releases for all three days.

* This past weekend at the New York State Women's Collegiate Athletic Association/Empire 8 Championships, the Stevens Institute of Technology women's swimming team was fantastic. The Ducks finished second behind Ithaca College, but had by far the best showing in the history of the program. Sophomore **Laura Barito** hit the NCAA A-cut in the 50- and 100-yard freestyle events to guarantee her a spot in the 2009 NCAA Division III Women's Swimming and Diving Championships as did the 200-yard medley relay team of freshman **Andrea Sturniolo**, junior **Stephanie Miller**, senior captain **Emily Woo**, and Barito.

* Stevens finished with 1,161.50 team points and second in both the NYSWCAA and Empire 8 Championships. Ithaca was first with 1,338 points and Stevens was followed by Union College in third and Nazareth College in fourth. Hartwick College rounded out the top-5 as a total of 16 teams competed in the event.

* Freshman **Cailin Grunewald** was named Empire 8 Rookie of the Meet. She won the Empire 8 title in the 500-yard freestyle in 5:04.87 and swam on the 200-, 400-, and 800-yard freestyle relay teams that all set Empire 8 championship records. The 400-team is currently ranked No. 5 in the country.

* Barito finished second in the 50-yard freestyle, but after just missing the A-cut, time trialed the event and that was when she turned in the 23.39, .32 better than the cut-time needed to automatically qualify. The Arkansas native's A-cut in the 100-free came after a second-place finish in which finished with recorded a time of 51.57. Both times were good for program-records

* The 200-yard medley relay team time-trialed its way into the NCAA's, carding a 1:45.05. All four athletes will head to the three-day NCAA's that begin on March 19 at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, Minn.

Stevens set four different Empire 8 records and was all-conference (first- or second-team) in 11 of the 20 events overall and Woo was named the 2009 Stevens Empire 8 Sportswoman of the Year.

In addition to the 23 different NCAA-cut times recorded and all-conference selections, the team essentially re-wrote the entire program-record book. The Ducks bested 17 of the 19 total school-bests in one championship; the 50-, 100-, 200-, 500-, 1000-, and 1650-yard freestyle, the 200-yard individual medley, the 100- and 200-yard breaststroke, the 100- and 200-yard backstroke, the 100-yard butterfly, and all five relay events (200-, 400-, and 800-yard free relays; 200- and 400-yard medley relays).

* The third-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team has been riding the wave of success recently as the Ducks tallied their 14 win of the year and fourth in North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Metro division play.

* Stevens swept both its opponents on the week in three straight, including a win over SUNY New Paltz, having avenged the five-game loss the Ducks encountered over a week ago. Stevens rolled over Polytechnic University as the Blue Jays did not break double-digit scoring figures in any of the three sets.

* Senior middle **Doug Reger** notched a .727 hitting percentage to help lift the Ducks past No. 14 SUNY New Paltz last Wednesday night in Hoboken, N.J. Reger had eight kills with no errors on 11 attempts and added a team-high seven blocks. He is currently fourth in the country for blocks per game of as he averages 1.51.

* Against the Hawks, senior outside hitter **Joe Trinsey** totaled 12 kills en route to a .417 hitting percentage on 24 swings with two errors. He led defensively with eight digs and three block assists. Senior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** and senior outside hitter **John Dennan** each landed eight kills as Dennan launched an and Cranford accumulated four blocks.

* In the win over Polytechnic, junior outside hitter **Andrew Fessler** produced a .667 hitting percentage on eight kills as the Ducks won 30-9, 30-7, 30-9.

* Sophomore outside hitter **Stefan PremDas** notched six kills and three block assists, while senior middle hitter **Wes Eberlin** hit .714 on the match with five kills on seven attempts and landed four total blocks.

* Sophomore **Brandt Grobeis** and sophomore **Aaron Ostrovsky** combined for 30 assists as Ostrovsky led with 20 and Grobeis dished out 10 assists. Sophomore outside hitter Bryant DeFranco led defensively with six digs.

* Stevens wrestling placed 5th of eight at the 2009 Centennial Conference Championships on Saturday.

* Freshman 174-pounder Ryan Dormann won a individual title with a thrilling, 1-0 win over Eric Schott of the United States Merchant Marine Academy.

* USMMA won its second-straight team championship, amassing 116.0 team points. Ursinus College finished second with 66.0 points and McDaniel was third (54.0). Muhlenberg College took fourth with 53.5 points and Stevens was fifth with 47.0. The Ducks were followed by Gettysburg College, Washington & Lee University, and Johns Hopkins University.

* USMMA had six individual titles and two seconds. Ursinus had four seconds, a third and three fourths. The Ducks had a first, two seconds, one third, and one fourth.

* Dormann, senior captain **Pat Conrad**, and freshman **Joe Favia** all made the finals as the Ducks had four wrestlers finish in the top three in their respective weight classes.

* Schott chose bottom to start the second after Dormann deferred, and once again, the Stevens freshman exuded a ton of strength, amassing two minutes of riding time and not giving up the escape point,

* Dormann chose bottom to start the third, came ever so close to a reversal 10 seconds in but could not seal the deal. 1:30 into the third, he was able to break loose to go up 1-0 and eventually won the 174-lb. title, 1-0.
