Stevens Athletics Week in Review

February 3, 2009

MEN'S BASKETBALL

Overall record11-8
 Empire 8 record4-6

* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's basketball team went 1-1 last week. The Ducks are currently in sixth place in the conference. They are a half-game behind Nazareth College and one game behind Utica College. Stevens hosts Utica on February 15, the last home game of the season.

* Nazareth College scored 55 points in a huge second half en route to an 87-72 victory over the Stevens Institute of Technology men's basketball team. The Golden Flyers went 20-for-30 from the floor over the game's final 20 minutes and turned a three-point halftime deficit into a 15-point win. Stevens was led by 19 points from senior guard **Virgil Gray**.

* Stevens was in fighting distance at 60-53 with 11:12 to go, but the Golden Flyers scored 11 of the game's next 13 points to put the game away.

* Senior guard **Anthony Passalacqua** had 18 points, and **Michael Baker** added 16 to go along with five rebounds.

* Senior guard **Virgil Gray** scored a game-high 27 points as Stevens earned a thrilling, 64-61 overtime victory over 21st-ranked St. John Fisher College at the Canavan Arena in Hoboken, N.J. on Sunday afternoon. Gray scored four of the six Stevens points in overtime as the Ducks improve to 11-8 overall and 4-6 in the Empire 8. Senior guard **Anthony Passalacqua** scored the 1,000th point of his career with 9:21 remaining in the second half when he drilled a three-pointer to put the Ducks up, 45-41.

* Gray finished with 27 points, five rebounds, and three assists for Stevens. Junior **Matt Higgins** was solid in the second half for the Ducks, going 4-for-4 from the floor. He finished with nine points and five rebounds, and Baker ended the contest with seven points, nine assists, and eight boards. The Ducks shot 38.7 percent on the afternoon but converted on nine of their 12 free-throw attempts.

* The Ducks close out a seven-game homestand on Friday when they host Alfred University at 8 p.m. The Ducks hit the road for games against first and second place in the conference (Ithaca - 2nd place, RIT - 1st place).

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Overall record16-3
 Empire 8 record8-2

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's basketball team earned a pair of conference wins over the weekend as the Ducks edged out Nazareth College and St. John Fisher College.

* The Ducks avenged an early season loss to Fisher when they took down the Cardinals Sunday, 77-43. Senior point guard **Dani Dudek** landed 16 points on seven of 13 shooting. Dudek dished out nine assists on the day and pulled down seven total rebounds.

* Overall, the Ducks shot 52.5 percent from the field and out-rebounded the Cardinals 51 to 37.

* Freshman guard **Dawn Garcia** finished the game with 10 points and eight rebounds.

* Junior forward **Brittany Fuller** tallied 12 points, while junior guard **Sarah Gehring** posted 11 points and five boards.

* Freshman forward Jillian Barrett recorded a team-high 13 rebounds and added three assists in the win.

* The National Collegiate Athletic Association recently publicized its sixth national ranking summary for women's basketball, and Stevens Institute of Technology senior guard **Dani Dudek** is currently third in the country in assists per game with a 7.2 average through 19 games played. Dudek is also 20th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.03) and 40th in field-goal percentage (52.8). The Ducks are ranked in nine statistical team categories as well.

* As a team, the Ducks are ranked in the Top-50 for scoring margin (16th), field-goal percentage (14th), field-goal percentage defense (3rd), win-loss percentage (28th), assists per game (26th), assist-to-turnover ratio (5th), rebound margin (44th), scoring defense (26th) and three-point field-goal defense (21st).

* Stevens returns to action this Friday as the Ducks host their seventh-straight home contest against Alfred at 6 p.m.

MEN'S FENCING

Overall record8-9

* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's fencing team went 4-0 in the Stevens Invitational on Sunday afternoon at Walker Gymnasium in Hoboken, N.J. The Ducks opened the day with an 18-9 win over Cornell University and followed that up by rolling over New Jersey Institute of Technology, 23-4. Stevens then went on to defeat Stony Brook University, 23-4, and closed out its afternoon with a 21-6 win over the United States Military Academy.

* The Stevens (8-9) sabre squad led the way all afternoon, going 31-4 overall. The sabres went 7-2 versus Cornell, 8-1 versus NJIT, 8-1 against Stony Brook, and a perfect 9-0 versus Army.

* Stevens also got strong performances from senior foilists **Ben Hochberg** and **Lowden Charles**.

* The Ducks will return to competitive action on February 8 in Newark, N.J. versus Saint John's College, Drew University, Hunter College, Lafayette College, and Yeshiva University. All the action is set to begin at 10 a.m.

WOMEN'S FENCING

Overall record11-1

* Freshman sabriest **Krista Sticco** posted a flawless 12-0 mark after she surprised the coaches last week with her outstanding performance in her first outing as a collegiate fencer. Sticco helped the Stevens Institute of Technology women's fencing team to a 4-0 day as the Ducks defeated the University of Vermont, 21-6, the University of Rhode Island, 24-3, Mount Holyoke College, 20-7 and the University of New Hampshire, 21-6. After the day's performance, the team stands at 11-1 on the year and have won its last 10 meets.

* The sabre squad led the day having gone 32-4. Besides Sticco's undefeated mark, senior **Laura Sodon** and junior **Erica Mondadori** each recorded 10-2 showings. In epee, senior **Rachel Cannell** went 9-1, as sophomore **Meagan Ritter** finished 8-2. Senior **Sureen Roslan** rounded out the squad with her 7-1 mark.

* In foil, senior **Khairun Nisa Aziz** carded a 9-2 record, while freshman **Alexandra Lyons** finished 6-2.

* Head Coach **Linda Vollkommer-Lynch** of the Stevens women's fencing team has much to celebrate. In 1974, Vollkommer-Lynch was at the forefront of women's fencing here at Stevens. In her 35-year career, Vollkommer-Lynch has produced a .568 win-loss percentage as she prepared her squads for over 555 meets. Last Sunday, alumnae and current Stevens fencers came together to commemorate the great tradition that has been built over the years.

* There were a total of 75 people that attended the luncheon on Stevens' campus, including many fencing Hall of Famers.

* The Ducks will host the Stevens Invitational next Sunday at 9 a.m. at the Canavan Arena in Hoboken, N.J. The day will feature some of the most elite teams in the country. Making the trip is Hunter College, Temple University, Johns Hopkins University, Brandeis University and Queens College.

Women's Indoor Track & Field

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's indoor track and field team placed third of five teams at the Empire 8 Championships on Sunday in Rochester, N.Y. Stevens topped eight different school-records and won two individual championships on the day. Ithaca College repeated as conference champs, totaling 238.50 team points. Rochester Institute of Technology finished with 100 points and Stevens had 67.50. Nazareth College and Alfred University finished in fourth and fifth, respectively.

* Senior **Salme Cook** set a new school-record and won an individual conference championship. The school-best was set in the 200-meter dash and the Empire 8 title was in the 400. She carded a 27.34 in the 200, .23 better than the previous school-mark she set one week ago, and finished the 400 in 1:01.35.

* Junior **Melissa Franzese** set a new school-record in the one-mile run. She broke the tape at 5:34.10, good for third overall. Franzese was also second in the 5,000-meter run (19:23.97). Freshman **Amethyst Holder** turned a in 9.19 in the 55-meter hurdles, good for a school-record (third overall), and rookie **Alina Duran** won the conference championship in the shot put, tossing it 10.88 meters (35'8").

* **Grace Python** broke her own school record in the weight toss, and sophomore **Caroline Pawalowski** set a Stevens record in the triple jump (10.05 meters, 32'11").

* The 4x400 relay team set the final school-record of the day. Cook, Holder, **Shanna Beairsto**, and senior **Hillary Paul** combined to turn in a 4:20.96 and place third.

* Sophomore **Chika Ekweghariri** placed fourth in the 55-meter dash (7.80), and Beairsto was fourth in the 800-meter run, turning in a 2:29.85. Junior **Laura Goodman** was sixth in the high jump.

* Stevens will return to action on February 6 at the New Balance Invitational.

Men's Indoor Track & Field

* On Sunday afternoon in Rochester, N.Y., the Stevens Institute of Technology men's indoor track and field team finished third at the Empire 8 Championships. Ithaca College repeated as conference champs, edging Rochester Institute of Technology, 184-183. Stevens had 49 team points and was followed Alfred University and Nazareth College. Senior **Trevor Currie** was the conference champion in the pole vault and set a new school-record in the 55-meter dash.

* Currie won the pole vault, clearing 4.40 meters (14'5"). His school-best in the 55 was 6.71, edging the previous mark by .04. He also earned a sixth-place finish in the 200-meter dash.

* Sophomore **Bradford Antes** crossed the tape at 16:06.39 in the 5,000-meter run, good for fourth overall, and freshman **Victor Servito** was sixth in the 55-meter hurdles (8.55). The rookie also finished fifth in the high jump, clearing 1.77 meters (5'9.75").

* Junior **Kevin Morgera**, Currie, and freshmen **Drew Ballinger** and **Sean Vazquez** earned a third-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay, turning in a 3:31.69.

Sophomore **Nick Lowe** was third in the long jump (6.54 meters) and fourth in the triple jump (12.77 meters). Senior **Matt Reihl** tossed the shot put 11.80 meters and took fourth. He also was fifth in the weight throw (12.05 meters).

* "It was a great meet across the board," Head Coach **John Crawford** said. "We showed the many good things we can do as a team, and really raised the bar for the rest of our season."

* Stevens will return to action at the New Balance Invitational on February 6.

MEN'S SWIMMING

Overall record4-3

* Stevens men's swimming went 1-1 in two meets last week. The Ducks will visit Ramapo College on Saturday afternoon in their final dual-meet of the season.

* Stevens fell to the United States Merchant Marine Academy, 123-82 on Friday night at the De Baun Aquatic Complex. Kings Point won eight of the 11 total events on the evening to move to 10-1 in dual-meet action this season.

* Stevens opened the meet strongly, taking first in the 200-yard medley relay. The team of sophomores **Nicholas Walulik** and Preedy, and freshmen **Matthew Carpinella** and **Nagle** combined to turn in a 1:39.16. Freshman Matt Smith was solid in turning in a second-place finish in the 1000-yard freestyle (10:18.89) as sophomore **Daniel Pecoraro** placed second in the 200-free (1:49.30). Nagle touched at 22.26 in winning the 50-free, and Pecoraro earned his second, second-place finish in the 100-yard backstroke. He carded a 56.60. Smith was second in the 500-free, finishing a shade over five minutes (5:01.68), and Preedy got his win in the 100-yard breaststroke. The sophomore touched at 1:02.14, just .12 better than second place.

* Stevens rolled over Adelphi University, 117-73 on Saturday afternoon at the De Baun Aquatic Complex. The Ducks earned seven first-place finishes and were able to exhibition the final two events of the afternoon en route to the easy victory. Freshman **Matt Smith** notched two firsts for Stevens as the Ducks improved their dual-meet record to 4-3 on the season. Stevens honored its lone senior, captain **Will Gerboth**, prior to the meet. It was the last home meet of his four-year career.

* Stevens jumped out to a big lead early as the Ducks took first and second in the 200-yard medley relay. The team of sophomores **Nicholas Walulik** and **Matt Preedy**, and freshmen **Matthew Carpinella** and **John DiMiceli** finished in 1:40.87, almost six seconds better than second place.

* Smith got his first win in the 1,650-yard freestyle as he carded a 17:10.50. **Daniel Pecoraro** and freshman **Sean Iveson** took second and third in the 200-free, and Stevens took one, two, and three in the 50-yard freestyle. Freshman **Carl Nagle** placed first in the event, carding a 22.69. Nagle was followed by rookie **Steven Vealey** in second and DiMiceli in third. Walulik notched a first-place finish in the 200-yard individual medley (2:06.07), and freshman **Jonathan Wan** took third. Carpinella won the 100-yard butterfly by more than a full second as he carded a 56:58 in the win. Preedy and Nagle took first and second in the 100-yard freestyle (50.04, 50.18), and Walulik and freshman **Benjamin Watkins** were two-three in the 100-back. Smith's second first-place finish came in the 500-yard freestyle event. He turned in a 5:01.78 and was followed by Pecoraro in second.

* The women's swimming squad is currently ranked No. 24 in the CollegeSwimming.com Top-25. The Ducks went 1-0 last week and are 5-2 in dual-meets this season. Stevens will visit Ramapo College on Saturday at 2 p.m. in its final dual-meet of the season.

* In its final home meet of the season, the No. 24 Stevens women's swimming team rolled over Adelphi University, 120-69 at the De Baun Aquatic Complex. The Ducks won the first eight events en route to the easy win as six different Stevens swimmers notched first-place finishes. Prior to the meet, Stevens honored its two seniors, **Nicole Ogrosso** and captain **Emily Woo** as it was the last time they would swim at home in their careers.

* Stevens started strong, taking first and second in the 200-yard medley relay. Freshman **Andrea Sturnilo**, junior **Stephanie Miller**, and sophomores **Laura Barito** and **Sarah Parker** turned in a 1:56.68 in winning the event.

* Sophomore **Mary Chew** and freshman **Kimberly McCaffrey** finished one-two in the 1,650-yard freestyle. Chew finished with a time of 18:33.50 and McCaffrey carded an 18:44.33. Barito, Woo, and freshman **Hayley Hatfield** finished one, two, and three in the 200-yard freestyle (2:00.36, 2:02.26, 2:06.16). It was one of three events Stevens swept during the meet.

* The Ducks also swept the 50-free as freshman **Cailin Grunewald** was first, touching at 25.84. She was followed by freshman **Sian Pearson** and Parker. Freshman **Toni Diaz** placed first in the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:20.78.

* Stevens took the three top spots in the 100-yard butterfly. Junior **Gabrielle Czernik** took first with a time of 1:02.61 and was followed by Hatfield and Miller. Woo and Diaz took first and second in the 100-free (56.28, 58.27), and Chew was first in the 200-yard backstroke. Stevens would have taken first in the final three events, but the Ducks swam them in exhibition.

* Senior **Emily Woo** of the was honored as the Stevens Woman of the Year by the New Jersey Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women on Sunday afternoon on the campus of Seton Hall University in South Orange, N.J. Woo was selected by an awards committee of high ranking coaches and administrators in the Stevens Department of Athletics. The two-year team captain has been a great athlete, an admirable leader, and a great presence on campus since her arrival in Hoboken in 2005.

* The fourth-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team posted a 2-1 week having registered its first loss of the season to Division I Harvard University this past Saturday. In the recent win over Sacred Heart University, the Ducks and the Pioneers made history for the longest set played in all of collegiate men's and women's volleyball history. Game 1 went to Stevens in a 45-43 decision.

* Senior outside hitter **Tomas Bochicchio** recieved North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Metro division Player of the Week honors as he tallied 36 kills, six blocks and three aces in eight sets played. He also lofted 19 digs on the week. In the win over Endicott College, he led with 14 kills and produced a .444 hitting percentage on 27 swings with just two errors. He also landed and ace and four total blocks.

* Stevens was led by **Joe Trinsey**, who accumulated 14 kills, lifted 12 digs and notched six blocks. **Andrew Cranford** produced a .667 hitting percentage with 13 kills on 18 swings with just an error. He also had a team-high eight total blocks. **John Dennan** finished with 9 kills, 12 digs and three blocks.

* The NCAA recently publicized its first-ever national ranking summary for men's volleyball, and Stevens Institute of Technology junior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** currently leads the nation in hitting percentage (.549) through 21 sets played. He is also 15th for blocks per set (1.14) and 35th for kills per set (3.43). Senior outside hitters **Tomas Bochicchio** and **Joe Trinsey** are also listed among the Top-40 for a number of individual statistical categories.

* As a team, the Ducks are ranked within the Top-20 in every statistical category. Stevens sits atop of the ranks for team hitting percentage (0.342) and assists per game (14.91). The Ducks are 2nd in both kills per game (15.91) and match win/loss percentage (.857) for their 6-1 overall mark. Finally, Stevens is third in blocks per game (3.35) and 19th for both aces per game (1.57) and digs per game (10.35).

Overall record10-7
 Centennial Conference4-1

* The Stevens wrestling squad continued its fantastic wrestling since a 1-5 start. Stevens went 2-0 in Centennial Conference action on Saturday and has now won nine of its last 11 duals.

* On Saturday afternoon in Kings Point, N.Y. Stevens opened the day with a 25-15 win over Ursinus College and followed that up by defeating Muhlenberg College, 33-15. The wins move the Ducks to 10-7 overall and 4-1 in the Centennial Conference. Stevens was led by two pins from senior 197-pounder **Valentin Riazanov**, and a pin and a decision from junior heavyweight **James Roarty**.

* Stevens had six wrestlers go 2-0 on the afternoon and has now won nine times in its last 11 duals after a 1-5 start.

* The Ducks fell behind 9-0 early as Ursinus earned wins at 125 and 133 lbs, but senior captain **Pat Conrad** catapulted the Ducks right back in the match with a win by pin fall win at 141 lbs.

* Trailing 12-6 after a loss at 149 lbs., junior **Leo Dormann** won for the eighth-straight bout with a 7-2 decision over Chris Springer. Freshman **Joe Favia** earned a decision to tie the score at 12, and fellow rookie **Ryan Dormann** earned a major decision in the 174-lb. weight class to give the Ducks a 16-12 advantage.

* **Vincent Termini** dropped a decision at 184 lbs., but Riazanov came through with an enormous pin of Connor McNamara at 197 lbs. to give Stevens a 22-15 lead.

* Roarty closed out the match with a 3-0 decision over Fernando Jones in the 285-lb. weight class for the final margin.

* The Ducks jumped out to an early lead in the Muhlenberg match as freshman **Brad Warren** won by forfeit at 125 lbs. Junior Frank Maselli was pinned by Billy Hall as the Mules were able to tie the score at six two matches in. Conrad gave the Ducks a 9-6 lead by winning his second match of the day, an 8-5 decision over Kevin Homan at 141 lbs.

* The Mules took a 12-9 lead after a win by pin fall at 149 lbs., but the Ducks answered with three-straight wins to take a commanding, 21-12 lead. Leo Dormann won a major decision at 157 lbs., and Favia backed that up with a technical fall victory at 165 lbs. Favia won by a 21-3 final as the match was stopped at the end of the second period.

* Ryan Dormann won his second match of the day, 8-1 over Jusfin Fitch in the 174-lb. weight class to put the Ducks up 24-12. A win for the Mules at 184 lbs. wasn't enough as Stevens got pins from Riazanov and Roarty to end the match.

* The Ducks will return to the mat on February 4 when they visit Lycoming College. The match is scheduled for a 6 p.m. start.
