WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Overall record22-5
 Empire 8 record12-4

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's basketball team made history this past weekend as the first team in the program's 13-year existence to have advanced to the NCAA Division III Women's Basketball Championship after the Ducks claimed the Empire 8 title in a 59-57 win over the first-seeded Bombers of Ithaca College.

* Freshman **Melissa Collier** was named the tournament Most Valuable Player after she tallied 19 points, collected seven boards and drained a pair of free-throws with 7.8 seconds remaining to help secure the championship win over the Bombers. For her performance this week, Collier was tabbed the Empire 8 Player of the Week.

* Last week the Empire 8 announced its all-conference team as senior point guard **Dani Dudek** repeated as the Empire 8 Player of the Year and first-team recipient. Junior forward **Brittany Fuller** landed honorable mention all-league honors as well.

* It was back to a one-point game (53-52) in favor of Stevens with 2:36 left and the Bombers took a timeout to talk things over. A **Melissa Collier** layup increased Stevens' lead to three, and then **Dani Dudek** made it five when she weaved her way through the lane and over a defender with 34 seconds to go. Bixby then took it the length of the court to cut the margin to two (57-55) with 11 seconds remaining. Collier sunk both her free-throw attempts to secure the win, the Ducks first-ever Empire 8 title, and a bid to the NCAA Division III Tournament.

* **Dani Dudek** finished with 12 points, seven boards and four assists in the win. **Dawn Garcia** had nine points on three field-goals from downtown. **Paige Armstrong** tallied eight points as **Brittany Fuller** led with eight total rebounds. The Ducks out-rebounded the Bombers 43-42 and posted a 38.1 shooting percentage.

* Stevens will take on the University of Mary Washington at 6 p.m. on the campus of NYU. Mary Washington finished the regular season with an overall record of 23-5 and will be playing in its fifth-straight NCAA tournament.

* The Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team dropped its fourth game of the season in a heated pitchers dual against Mount Saint Mary College this past Saturday.

* Stevens junior lefty **Joe Finora** was splendid for the Ducks, tossing seven innings, allowing two runs (one earned) and striking out 10 in the loss.

* Freshman second baseman **Tom Phillips** led Stevens at the plate, going 3-for-3 with a double a run batted in.

* Sophomore catcher **Denis Ackerman** opened the bottom of the ninth with a double to left-center and advanced to third on a wild pitch. Senior **Dan Silva** walked and **Tom Phillips** came through with a clutch RBI single to cut the Blue Knight lead to one. Phillips then proceeded to steal second to put the winning run in scoring position with nobody out.

* Junior **Anthony Andrews** lined out hard to short for the first out, and junior **Mark Rasulo** grounded the ball up the middle for what looked to be base it, however, shortstop Max Tecce made a diving stop and caught Phillips between second and third for the second out. Gage then got a strikeout to end the threat and earn the save.

* Stevens went 1-for-11 with runners on base and stranded 10 on the evening.

* In 11 at-bats, freshman **Tom Phillips** leads the Ducks with a .545 batting average and has driven in three runners. He is also 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts.

* Junior **Mark Rasulo** is hitting .500 on the year with 10 hits, five runs scored and is the squad's RBI leader with six. He is also 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts and has one dinger on the year.

* Junior **Joe Finora** has tallied 20 strikeouts in 16.1 innings pitched. He is 1-2 on the year and has rendered nine earned runs.

* Stevens will return to play on Sunday vs. St. Joe's of L.I.

MEN'S FENCING

Overall record14-10

* The Stevens Institute of Technology men's fencing team did not compete this week.

* The Ducks will return to action at the NCAA Regionals on March 7, hosted by Drew University. Stevens has six fencers that have qualified for Regional action. In epee, first-year fencer **Keith Vandingstee** will be joined by junior **Steven DiPaola** to represent Stevens. Seniors **Ben Hochberg** and **Lowden Charles** will make their return to the strips in the foil division. For sabre, freshmen **David Gordon** and **Dzimitry Lamianski** will head into competition after an impressive freshman year.

* Last year, **Lowden Charles** reached the NCAA Finals and took 21st overall in the foil division. Charles posted a 7-16 record over the course of two days during the round-robin championships. Furthermore, Charles is the first foilist in Stevens history to have advanced that far into the championships. The last time a member of the Stevens fencing team reached the championship round was in 1981, as Lee Gee competed in the NCAA Finals in the sabre division.

WOMEN'S FENCING

Overall record17-6

* The Stevens Institute of Technology women's fencing team posted its best finish by a three weapon squad in the 35-year history of the program during this year's National Intercollegiate Women's Fencing Association Championships.

* Senior epeeist **Rachel Cannell** finished in fourth-place as both the foil and epee squads took fifth overall, while sabre recorded its best finish ever of sixth. As a result, the Ducks tallied 16 points as a team to place third. Temple University received the gold medal with three points and Johns Hopkins claimed silver with eight points; the fewer the points, the higher the placing.

* Stevens defeated conference rival, Haverford College by just one bout as the Fords came in fourth at the competition. Cannell made the final 16 in the epee division as she drew teammate, sophomore **Meagan Ritter**. **Rachel Cannell** came away victorious as Ritter placed within the top-16.

* Senior foilist **Khairun Nisa Aziz** finished strong taking eighth overall, while junior **Danielle Bisson** placed within the top-16 in the foil division. In sabre, junior **Erica Mondadori** had a stellar outing as she too placed inside the top-16.

* It was the best performance that we have ever had since it became a three-weapon sport, said Head **Coach Linda Vollkommer-Lynch**. I was surprised by the team's overall effort and I'm very proud of how Stevens performed both individually and as a unit.

* A few weeks ago, Stevens submitted its candidates that had the proper criteria to make the NCAA cut. The team found out that all seven fencers that were presented will be competing in the first round of the NCAA Championships. The Ducks received three spots in epee and two in both foil and sabre. Cannell, Ritter and senior Sureen Roslan represent the epee squad. Mondadori and senior Laura Sodon have advanced in the sabre division, while Aziz and first-year fencer Alexandra Lyons will compete in foil.

* The No. 8 Stevenson University men's lacrosse defeated No. 15 Stevens Institute of Technology on Saturday afternoon at the De Baun Athletic Complex in Hoboken, N.J. * The Mustangs struck first exactly six minutes into the first quarter when freshman Rob Lamey (Chester, Pa.) scored an unassisted goal. Stevens answered 4:23 later, knotting the score at one when freshman midfielder **Kevin Rose** found net after a nice feed from Laurita.

* Stevenson (2-0) scored the next two goals to build a 3-1 lead, but Stevens did not back down, tallying three of the game's next four goals to go into the locker room tied at four. **Matt Keating** scored his fifth of the season to pull the Ducks within one at 3-2, and after Stevenson scored to go up two, Laurita scored his first after a gorgeous pass over the top of the cage from sophomore attackman **Joey Simone**. Sophomore **Alex Couture** scored the equalizer thanks to an assist from Keating with 44 ticks left in the half.

* In the second half, Stevenson struck first. The Mustangs got a tally from senior midfielder Chris Baldwin (Baltimore, Md.) 4:15 in to go up 5-4, but sophomore midfielder **Brandon Faubert** pulled the Ducks even with his first of the season 4:24 later.

* Stevenson went on to score the game's next three goals to build a three-goal advantage that the Ducks were just not able to overcome. Laurita scored 43 seconds into the fourth quarter to make the score 8-6, and Rose notched his second of the game, going coast-to-coast down the right sideline after a turnover to get Stevens (1-1) within one with 13:18 remaining, but that would be as close as the Ducks could come.

* Junior attackman Richie Ford (Baltimore, Md.) gave Stevenson some insurance with 11:53 left, and the Mustangs then proceeded to control tempo and possession over the final 10-plus minutes to secure the win.

* The third-ranked Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team has increased its win streak to five matches as the Ducks picked up a 3-0 victory against Baruch College after they upended nationally ranked New York University 3-1 this past week.

* For the third time this season, the Ducks have rolled over NYU. Senior middle hitter **Andrew Cranford** produced 24.5 points on 20 kills, 3.5 blocks and a service ace as the Ducks notched 23 team blocks and hit .444 in the four-set win.

* The Ducks snatched the life out of NYU in the final set. Ahead 16-12, Stevens went on to post its 15th win of the season off a 14-4 run. Cranford had a pair of kills as senior outside hitter **Joe Trinsey** got in on the action when he recorded three-straight points to put the Ducks up by 12 (27-15). The match ended with three errors on the Violets as they registered 16 in the game, while the Ducks posted four blocks.

* One of the deciding factors in tonight's win, other than out-blocking NYU 23-13, was the serve/recieve by both squads. Stevens, who usually has trouble in that department, landed five aces and kept their errors to a minimum (9). NYU tallied four service aces but had 13 miscues on the night.

* Senior **Andrew Cranford** led the way with his .667 hitting percentage having drilled 20 kills on 27 swings and only two errors. He finished third on the team with six total blocks. **Stefan PremDas** had 17 kills with three errors on 32 attempts for a .438 attacking percentage. He landed an ace and three block assists. Senior **Doug Reger** was a 6'4" wall at the net, having picked up 10 total blocks, notched nine kills on 19 swings for a .368 hitting percentage. **Michael Bertucci** lifted 11 digs, while sophomore **Brandt Grobeis** dished out 58 assists and had a career-high eight total blocks.
