Bobby Hurley

*Head Coach * Third Season * Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute * 2001*

Bobby Hurley is in his third season as the head coach of the Stevens Institute of Technology men's basketball team. Hurley has been a part of the Stevens basketball program for the last eight years. During his first two seasons at the helm, Stevens has an overall record of 31-22 and has made the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) quarterfinals twice.

Last year, the Ducks went 18-9 overall and 10-6 in the Empire 8. They reached the conference tournament semifinals before falling to top seed St. John Fisher College in Rochester, N.Y. The Ducks went 9-5 at home and 9-4 on the road in addition to reaching the ECAC quarters. Three different student-athletes received all-conference accolades from the Empire 8 and a total of five have earned that distinction with Hurley at the helm. The 2009-10 season saw Stevens win six more games overall, and four more games in the Empire 8, as the Ducks improved in team defense, field-goal percentage, three-point field-goal percentage and rebounding. Stevens twice had seven-game winning streaks in addition to leading the Empire 8 in three-point shooting.

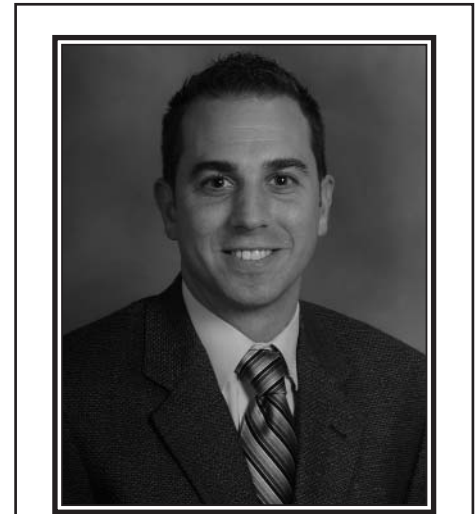
In his first season at the helm, Hurley guided the Ducks to an overall record of 13-13 and an appearance in the quarterfinals of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Metro Tournament. Both Anthony Passalacqua and Virgil Gray were named all-

conference and Gray was named first-team All-Met as well. The team received the prestigious Schoenfeld Award from the area's officials for excellence in sportsmanship and conduct, and both Passalacqua and Matt Higgins were named to the National Honors Court for excellence in the classroom.

Originally hired in August of 2003, Hurley spent his first three seasons working as an assistant under former coach Steve Hayn. Hurley remained as an assistant following the hiring of Josh Loeffler in 2006 and then was promoted to associate head coach 2007-08. In 2006-07, Hurley was instrumental in helping lead the Ducks to their finest season in program history. Along the way, Stevens set a new school record for wins in a season with a 23-7 mark. The Ducks also made their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16 following victories over Worcester Polytechnic Institute and Ramapo College. Stevens ended the year ranked first in the NCAA Atlantic Region and No. 24 in the D3hoops.com national poll. In his final season as an assistant (2007-08), Hurley was on the bench once again as the Ducks tied the school record for wins with a 23-6 mark and shared the Empire 8 regular-season title with Ithaca College in just their first year in the conference. Stevens also won its first-ever Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Metro Championship.

A 2001 graduate of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute with a Bachelor of Science degree in Management and Technology, Hurley was a four-year starter for the Red Hawks and was selected as a Verizon Academic All-American in 2001. An All-Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association honorable mention selection as both a junior and senior, Hurley appeared in a school-record 107 games and made 85 starts. He was also named to the UCAA all-tournament team as a senior. Hurley was named team captain and most valuable player his last two seasons with the Red Hawks. He finished his career at Rensselaer with 767 points, 316 assists, and 155 steals. Hurley led the team in assists and steals three times.

After graduating from Rensselaer, Hurley worked with Hoop Group – one of the largest basketball instructional organizations in the country – as the Assistant Director of Instructional Programming from March 2002 through July 2003. He also served as the director of the Pocono Invitational Basketball Camp in Pennsylvania. During the summer of

2007 and once again in 2008, Hurley directed the Get Ahead Sports men's summer basketball league in Hoboken. Additionally, he has been involved in organizing and running the Stevens Basketball Camp each of the past seven years.

Brendan Twomey

Assistant Coach
Third Season

Brendan Twomey is in his third season as the top assistant on the Stevens men's basketball coaching staff.

In 2009-10, Twomey helped the Ducks to an 18-9 record (10-6 Empire 8), a trip to the semifinals of the Empire 8 Championship, and the quarterfinals of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Metro Tournament. Three Ducks earned all-conference honors, and under Twomey's tutelage, the Ducks led the Empire 8 in three-point field-goal percentage. Over the course of his two years, Stevens has an overall mark of 31-22. In his first season, Twomey helped guide the Ducks to an overall mark of 13-13 and an appearance in the quarterfinals of the ECAC Metro Championship.

While working for the NBA, Twomey edited game film for the NBA, NBDL, and WNBA. He analyzed offensive and defensive possessions from events such as the NBA Finals and FIBA Americas Championship. Twomey played professional basketball for three different organizations between 2004 and 2006. In June of 2004, he played for the Carolina Thunder of the American Basketball Association. In January of the following year, he went overseas to play for the Limerick Lions of the Irish Superleague. Nine months later, he joined the Merry Monk Ballina Braves of the Irish Superleague.

Twomey also had a remarkable playing career at Mount Saint Mary. After transferring from the SUNY Oneonta after his freshman year, he went on to score 1,503 points in three years at MSMC. He currently ranks second in the record book in points and three-point field goals made (309). He holds the top spot in career three-point field goal percentage (41.6%), three-point field goals made per game (3.6), season free-throw percentage (85.7%), career free-throw percentage (81.3%), and steals in a season (96). A two-year captain, Twomey was named the 2003-04 Skyline Conference Player of the Year and was tabbed All-District by the National Association of Basketball Coaches and DIII News. He was also selected to the first-team All-Skyline Conference three times. Upon graduation, he had ranked in the Top 100 in the nation in 10 different statistical categories.

Michael Collins

Assistant Coach
Second Season

Michael Collins is in his second season as an assistant with the Stevens men's basketball team in 2010-11.

In 2009-10, the Stevens graduate was a member of a coaching staff that helped to engineer a five-win improvement from the previous season. He helped guide the Ducks to the semifinals of the Empire 8 Championship tournament and a berth in the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Metro Tournament. Three players were named all-conference, including Ducks' forward Simon Smith.

In 2008-09, Collins was an integral part of a the women's basketball coaching staff that led the team to its first-ever Empire 8 Championship and NCAA Tournament win. He helped guide the Ducks to countless program firsts and saw the team compile an overall record of 47-12 in his two seasons. He also help lead the lady Ducks to the first ECAC Metro title in program history in their 2007-08 campaign.

As an undergrad at Stevens, Collins appeared in 88 games and made 64 starts for the men's program from 2002-07. During his career, he amassed 515 points, 452 rebounds, and 173 blocked shots. Collins ranks first all-time at Stevens in career blocks. In addition to his career mark for blocks, Collins is the Ducks' single-season record-holder for total blocks (75) and blocks per game (3.00) – both marks were set in 2003-04. He also established a Stevens single-game high with eight blocked shots during that same season.

As a senior, he helped lead the team to an impressive 23-7 overall record and the program's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, Stevens went on to win a pair of games to reach the Sweet 16 before losing to eventual national champion Amherst College. Upon completion of his playing career, Collins was awarded the prestigious Frank Partel Basketball Award for dedication and service to the men's basketball program.

Collins graduated from Stevens in May of 2007. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Social Science. He is currently pursuing his master's degree in Sports Medicine.

Dave Klatsky

Assistant Coach
Fourth Season

Dave Klatsky is in his fourth season as an assistant coach with the Stevens men's basketball team. He is involved in the planning of all practices, player development, scouting, game preparation, and many other facets of the program.

Last year, Klatsky helped guide the Ducks to a record of 18-9 overall and 10-6 in the conference as they reached the Empire 8 Championship semifinals and the quarterfinals of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Metro Tournament. During his first season on the staff in 2007-08, Klatsky helped guide the Ducks to an overall record of 23-6. Stevens finished the year ranked fifth in the NCAA East Region and shared the Empire 8 regular-season title with Ithaca College. The team also went on to win it's first-ever ECAC Metro title.

Klatsky owns a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics with dual concentration in Finance and Accounting from the University of Pennsylvania (Wharton School). He graduated in May of 2003.

While at Penn, Klatsky helped the Quakers men's basketball team earn berths to the NCAA Tournament in 1999-2000, 2001-02, and 2002-03. Klatsky set Penn's single-season assist record tin 2000-01. He led the Ivy League in assist-to-turnover ratio the three seasons he was a starter (2000-01, 2001-02, and 2002-03).



Season Preview

Coming off an 18-win season and a return to the Empire 8 Men's Basketball Championship, Head Coach **Bobby Hurley (Hoboken, N.J.)** and the rest of the Ducks hope to improve upon a trip to the conference tournament semifinals and an appearance in the quarterfinals of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Metro Tournament one year ago.

Senior center/forward **Bryan Franklin (Highlands Ranch, Colo.)** is the captain of the team and will be asked to lead a relatively young group throughout 2010-11. Franklin has been a solid contributor off the bench for Stevens over the last two seasons and will see an increased role as one of just two seniors on the team. The coaching staff will look for him to anchor the defense and provide a consistent presence on both ends of the floor. A strong communicator, Franklin will need to make quality decisions with the ball. He played in 26 contests last year, averaging 4.4 points and 3.8 rebounds per game, and shooting over 50 percent from the floor. He pulled down a total of 100 rebounds.

"Bryan is one of the most vocal players on the floor all the time - in practice and during games," said Hurley. "He has improved greatly over the course of his three seasons and will be the leader our team needs."

Fellow senior **Christopher McNay (Los Angeles, Calif.)** is another player that has improved immensely in his time at Stevens and will be an important piece down low if the Ducks are to have a successful season. A hard worker, McNay will see consistent and valuable minutes, and the coaching staff

hopes he, like Franklin, will be a consistent presence underneath on both offensive and defensive ends of the courts.

Junior forward **Simon Smith (Cranford, N.J.)** led Stevens in scoring and rebounding as a sophomore and was named second-team All-Empire 8. Smith started 27-of-27 games for the Ducks and averaged 12.4 points and 8.8 rebounds per contest. Smith had 11 double-doubles and came to camp with increased strength and quickness. The Cranford, N.J. native will be looked upon to provide more leadership and with continued development, should see increased numbers across the board.

Junior guard **Mike Cutri (West Caldwell, N.J.)** is coming off a season in which he was named honorable mention all-conference. Cutri was second in the Empire 8 in three-point field-goal percentage, connecting on 47.4 percent of his attempts from long range. He averaged 11.9 points and almost three rebounds per game, starting all 27 contests for the Ducks. The junior will have to work harder for shots after playing well in 2009-10, and in addition to being more consistent on the defensive end of the floor, Cutri will have to be one of the team's most consistent scorers.

Guard **Russ Thompson (West Orange, N.J.)** leads a talented sophomore class. The West Orange, N.J. native got better and better as the 2009-10 season progressed and ended up leading the conference in three-point shooting. Thompson was big down the stretch for the Ducks, and with improved defense and ball handling, will see a much

larger role for the team this year. He played in all 27 games as a rookie, averaging 6.5 points and shot 48.8 percent from long range.

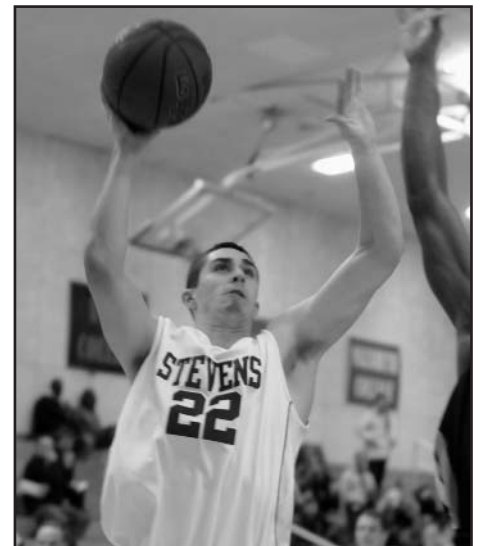
Sophomore guard **Sheldon Jones (Queens, N.Y.)** put a lot of work in during the off season and has impressed during preseason with better decision making and improved shooting. One of the most athletic players on the team, Jones averaged 4.2 points and 1.6 rebounds in 26 games as a freshman.

Sophomore forward **Max Schwartz (Bridgewater, N.J.)** was the most improved player last season and has continued to develop in the early stages of this year. Schwartz will be asked to be a constant contributor of the bench and with his size, should have an effect on all aspects of the game. He saw action in 21 contests, totaling 49 points and 20 rebounds.

"All three of our returning sophomores have the chance to be important players for us," said Coach Hurley. "If they continue to work hard, improve on the defensive end, and develop their all-around games, we will be that much closer to getting to where we need to be."

Freshman **Kevin McManamy (Charlotte, N.C.)** joins the squad for his first season and will immediately provide the coaching staff with increased depth up front. A smart player, McManamy will help the Ducks with excellent skills and a strong passing ability.

Freshman **Patrick Sabatino (Westfield, N.J.)** leads a talented freshman class as the for-

ward will see minutes for the Ducks right away. Athletic with a strong inside and outside game, Sabatino will fit well into the Stevens rotation.

Freshman **Matt Skrelja (Clark, N.J.)** has also impressed early on with a strong basketball IQ, good court vision, and passing ability. Freshman **Andrew Meszaros (Phoenixville, Pa.)** will provide depth in the Stevens backcourt and has also displayed strong passing and a quality mid-range game during training camp.

Sophomore guard **Mike Nattis (Woodbury, N.Y.)**, freshman guard **Phillip DeSeignora (Boston, Mass.)**, and freshman guard **Mahdi Masri (Clifton, N.J.)** will all be vying for minutes off the bench.

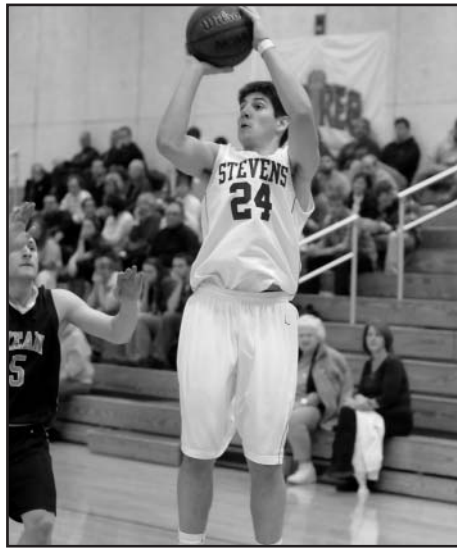
Stevens was one of the better teams in the Empire 8 in field-goal percentage defense last year, holding the opposition to 40.9 percent shooting and 65.6 points per game. Opponents also shot just 33 percent from long range.

"If we are going to be successful this year and get to where we want to go, it starts with our defense," Coach Hurley said. "We need a commitment to the defensive end for 40 minutes during every game we play."

The Ducks were 6-2 in conference road games and 4-4 in Empire 8 home games in 2009-10 and made it to the Empire 8 Championship semifinals before falling to NCAA Tournament participant St. John Fisher College. Stevens missed the conference tournament in 2008-09.

Stevens was second in the Empire 8 in scoring margin at plus-7.2, overall defense, allowing 65.6 points per game, field-goal percentage (47.2 percent), field-goal percentage defense (40.9 percent), and assists. The Ducks were tops in the conference in three-point field-goal percentage (40.9 percent).

After opening the season against Baruch on November 15, Stevens will host its annual tip-off tournament on the 19th and 20th. The Ducks will take on Hunter College in the Friday game and will then face either William Paterson University or Emory & Henry College on Saturday night.

Stevens will hit the road for a pair of non-conference tilts before returning home to host Rutgers University-Camden in the final tune-up for Empire 8 play.

The Ducks open up their conference slate at Utica College on December 10. After Winter Break, Stevens will visit Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute before returning to Empire 8 play on January 7 and 8 at Rochester Institute of Technology and Nazareth College.

Stevens will host the United States Merchant Marine Academy in a non-conference game prior to a pair of conference home games against Fisher and Alfred University on January 14 and 15. A three-game conference road trip against Ithaca College, Elmira College, and Hartwick College is next, before the Ducks return to the Canavan Arena to host Utica on January 28.

The final non-conference game of the season is on February 1 against the College of Staten Island and after visits to Alfred and Fisher, Stevens will close out its regular-season schedule with five-straight conference home games from February 11-19. The Empire 8 Championship will take place on February 25 and 26 at the regular-season champ.

THE STEVENS ADVANTAGE . . .

The Stevens Institute of Technology Athletic Complex is comprised of over \$20 million in facilities and caters to only 2,200 students.

Stevens opened its \$13 million Charles V. Schaefer, Jr. Athletic & Recreation Center in 1994. The Athletic Training Center contains a rubberized flooring which can accommodate soccer, tennis, basketball, volleyball and other activities. The second level contains the six-lane 25-yard De Baun Aquatic Center, a Jacuzzi, showers, locker rooms and an athletic training room. The third level features the Canavan Arena, a multi-purpose arena ideal for basketball, volleyball, fencing and other indoor activities. The top floor houses a fitness center containing cardiovascular and weight-training equipment plus a conference/classroom for video or personal instruction.

Walker Gymnasium re-opened in 2004 with its \$4 million modernizing renovation. The facility has central air conditioning, a state-of-the-art weightlifting facility, coaches' offices, five team locker rooms with showers, a recruiting lounge and many aesthetic upgrades. The main floor continues to house the basketball/volleyball court with a raised running track.

During the summer of 2007, the De Baun Athletic Complex underwent a major renovation as the existing NeXturf surface was replaced with state-of-the-art FieldTurf. This marked a significant upgrade to the surface and provided Stevens with a first-class outdoor facility. The De Baun Athletic Complex is home to a number of varsity teams and is used for intramural sports, physical education classes and recreation.

Furthermore, in 2007, Stevens reached an agreement to share the brand-new Weehawken Recreation Center and Waterfront Park, which is located approximately two miles from campus. This facility will be used by varsity and intramural sports as well as campus recreation.

Stevens is one of few Division III institutions in the nation to establish a private strength and conditioning training facility (4,000 square feet) for exclusive use by its varsity athletes. Year-round strength and conditioning programs for each sport are devised through consultations between the sport's head coach and two full-time strength and conditioning coaches.
