# Bri Fecteau

Head Coach \* First Season \* Bentley College '01

Entering her first season, Bri Fecteau, the fifth head coach in the program's 24-year history, inherits a Ducks squad that has amassed a 65-23 record since joining the Empire 8 in the fall of 2007. The Westport, Maine native joins Stevens after a successful seven-year stint as an assistant coach at Harvard University.

"I'm very excited about the opportunity to be a part of this program and have had a positive experience from the moment I stepped on campus," said Fecteau. "Stevens is filled with so many amazing people and I feel fortunate to have this opportunity. I got a chance to meet some of our student-athletes who are a motivated group both on and off the court. They are the type of student-athletes I like to surround myself with and I look forward to helping them achieve their goals and improve their lives. It was a great fit."

Fecteau joined the Harvard coaching staff as a second assistant in 2003 before being promoted to first assistant in 2009. During her tenure with the Crimson, Harvard compiled a 120-77 overall mark with a 75-25 Ivy League record. She helped develop four All-Ivy performers, including a pair of first-team honorees, and the 2004-05 All-Ivy Player of the Year, Reka Cserney.

"We are thrilled to welcome Bri to the Stevens athletics family as our new head women's basketball coach," said Director of Athletics Russell Rogers. "As a candidate, she presented the perfect mix of experience, basketball knowledge, and engaging personality that will make her a perfect fit at our institution."

At Harvard, Fecteau helped facilitate the day-to-day operations of the women's basketball program and was responsible for film editing and exchange, scouting, and recruiting. As part of her on-court coaching responsibilities, Fecteau worked with all positions – with a special concentration on guard development.

During her seven seasons at Harvard, the Crimson captured three Ivy League titles in 2005, 2007, and 2008, earning an NCAA Tournament berth in 2007, while making two Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) berths in 2009 and 2010. She also served as the head coach of the Crimson's junior varsity program.

"The experience I gained from the past seven years at Harvard is invaluable," Fecteau said. "I had the pleasure of working with and learning from Kathy Delaney-Smith who is an amazing person and an amazing coach and I feel like I'm prepared to deal with any type of situation.

Harvard was an amazing place and it's great to be at another institution that strives for both academic and athletic excellence."

A 2001 graduate of Bentley University, Fecteau enjoyed a decorated four-year career as a member of the Falcons' women's basketball team, earning countless honors, while helping lead Bentley to a 120-15 overall record, three Northeast-10 regular season championships, and three NCAA Elite Eight appearances.

One of only two players to serve as a team captain for three seasons, Fecteau – just the eighth junior to top the 1,000-point plateau – ranks in Bentley's top-10 in seven statistical categories, finishing first in games played (135), third in assists (573), and tenth in points (1,307).

As a senior she led the Falcons to a 31-3 overall mark, earning Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA)/Kodak Division II honorable mention All-America accolades, Daktronics Division II All-Northeast Region honors, and NCAA Division II Northeast Regional All-Tournament team recognition.

"In college I was again fortunate enough to play for another amazing coach, Barbara Stevens, who is leader in the coaching community," said Fecteau. "There was a great sense of pride in the program at Bentley. That's something that I believe already exists here at Stevens and it's a tradition that we want to continue."

Since 2007, Fecteau has also served as the owner, director, and lecturer of the Net Results Basketball Camp. As a business partner and Director of Marketing for the New England based camp entering its 26th year, she helped coordinate all of its operational aspects, while serving as a lecturer on shooting fundamentals, defensive concepts, and life skills.

A 2009 inductee into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame, Fecteau enjoyed a stint with the Katwijk Grasshoppers, a professional women's basketball team in Holland. Since graduating with a B.S. degree in Marketing, she has also served as an Account Coordinator at Reebok International in Canton, Mass., an Assistant Project Manager for Univentio Group BV in Katwijk, Holland, and an Office Administrator for the Bentley athletic department.

Last season, the Ducks posted an 18-11 record en route to their second Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Metro Championship game berth in three seasons. Fecteau will eventually



look to guide Stevens to its second NCAA Tournament appearance. The Ducks earned their first-ever NCAA Tournament berth during the team's 23-6, 2008-09 season.

"I believe that we have the ability to make another run at the Empire 8 Championship and the NCAA Tournament," Fecteau said. "I'm fortunate in that we have a lot of talent (at Stevens) and our student-athletes are very self-motivated. I'm happy to be here and look forward to helping them get back to where they want to be – back to the NCAAs."

Rounding out Fecteau's coaching staff, are assistant coaches **Bridget Catanese** and **Dani Dudek**. Catanese enters her first season with the Ducks after previously serving as the graduate assistant women's basketball coach at Gallaudet University in Washington, D.C., while Dudek begins her second full season on the sideline after a decorated four-year playing career with the Ducks. As a graduate assistant for the Bisons, Catanese assisted in developing offensive and defensive plays and structuring the team's strength and conditioning programs.

"Bridget (Catanese) and Dani (Dudek) are excellent coaches and more importantly excellent people. Bridget goes above and beyond no matter the task and already has a great connection with the girls. She has a personality that people gravitate toward and really knows how to reach and motivate the team," explained Fecteau. "Being a former standout player here at Stevens, Dani brings that intangible love and passion for the game and for the Ducks. She is a great role model for our student-athletes and we are all lucky to have her."

# Season Preview

With seven returnees from last season's 18-11 squad that earned an Eastern College Athletic Conference Metro Division Championship game berth, the Stevens Institute of Technology women's basketball team enters the 2010-11 season with its sights set on a second Empire 8 title and NCAA Tournament appearance.

"The team is very motivated to compete and get back to the NCAA's. Although we will take one game at a time, we have our sights set on a second conference championship," said first-year head coach Bri Fecteau. "In order to reach our goal, we will strive to get better as a team each time we step on the court."

Coming off its first-ever conference crown and NCAA Tournament appearance during the 2008-09 season, the Ducks posted an 18-11 overall mark a year ago with a 12-4 league ledger. A pair of Ducks earned all-conference accolades for their efforts as Stevens finished the season ranked first in the Empire 8 in rebounding margin (+8.8), second in scoring defense (55.8), and third in scoring margin (+6.8) and field-goal defense – while holding opponents to a paltry .338 shooting percentage from the field.

Among those hoping to build upon last year's success are a trio of returning starters in junior guard **Dawn Garcia**, junior forward **Jillian Barrett**, and senior forward **Paige Armstrong**.

"I am very fortunate to have inherited a team with such talented and determined upperclassmen," said Fecteau. "With their leadership and work ethic we will definitely be a team to contend with this year."

Garcia, an all-Empire 8 honorable mention selection a year ago, ranked second on the team in points and assists per game with 9.8 and 3.14, respectively. As the team's primary point-guard, the Brooklyn, N.Y. native finished the season ranked third in the league in assist to turnover ratio (1.25).

Currently first all-time in program history in career three-point percentage (.344), Garcia buried 46 shots from behind the arc last year, the sixth-highest single-season total in school history. She also holds the highest single-season three-point percentage on the Ducks' charts, connecting on 42 percent of her attempts as a freshman in 2008-09.

One of three seniors, Armstrong returns after enjoying a solid junior season in which she made 21 starts, averaging 7.5 points and 7.0 rebounds per contest. The efficient Fair Haven, N.J. native, who holds the program's top-two single season

marks in field-goal percentage, enters the year as the Ducks' career field-goal percentage leader (.588), while ranking sixth on the career rebounds chart with 6.7 per game.

Hoping to help solidify the Stevens frontline is Barrett, who made 23 starts last year, averaging 9.3 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. A solid rebounder and one of the Ducks' biggest threats inside, Barrett ranked third in the league in offensive rebounds, while finishing fifth in the conference in field-goal percentage (.454).

Also returning to the squad this season are **Victoria O'Connor**, **Kathleen Schuckers**, and **Isaura Guzman**.

A senior center, O'Connor will look to be one of the Ducks' focal points in the middle this season, after finishing the 2009-10 campaign averaging 7.7 points and 7.9 rebounds per game. The Westwood, N.J. was especially impressive on the defensive end, leading the team in blocks with 31, while ranking fifth in the league in rebounding.

Schuckers, a junior guard who averaged 5.3 points and 3.38 assists per contest, will look to build upon a quality sophomore showing in which she finished the season ranked first in the Empire 8 in assist to turnover ratio (1.44), while Kleinhans and Guzman will look to give Stevens some added depth.

Having sat out last season, senior **Brianne Lavin** and junior **Victoria Webber** will aim to shore up the Ducks' lineup. As a reserve guard, Lavin appeared in all 29 games during the 2008-09 season – ranking third on the team in assists – while Webber averaged 5.8 points and 3.0 rebounds.

Rounding out the Stevens' squad are a talented group of freshmen in **Catherine Keough**, **Lisa Tessitore**, **Molly Spadaro**, **Jen Thompson** and **Avis Benjamin**.

Stevens will begin its 2010-11 season with a five-game homestand starting with its season-opener against The College of New Jersey on November 15. The Ducks will then host its annual Tip-Off Tournament on November 20-21 before welcoming the University of Scranton and the City College of New York on December 1 and 5.

Stevens will travel to the College of Staten Island on December 7 before opening Empire 8 play at Utica College on December 10. After a three-week layoff, the Ducks host Brooklyn College on December 30 before christening the New Year with match-up against Hunter College on January 3. Stevens returns to conference play on January 7-8 against Rochester Institute of Technology and Nazareth College before facing St. John Fisher College and Alfred University.

Following away games at Ithaca College, Elmira College, and Hartwick College, the Ducks will play host to Utica on January 28. Stevens then hits the road on February 4-5 to once again take on Alfred and St. John Fisher before closing out the season with six home games culminating in a February 19 showdown with Ithaca College.

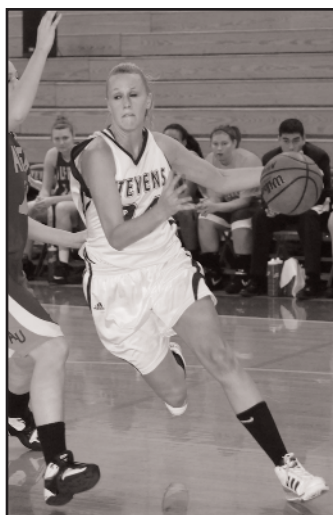

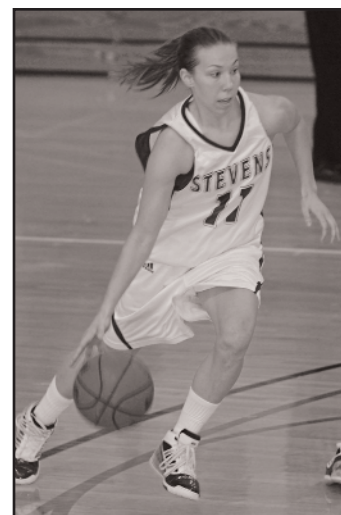

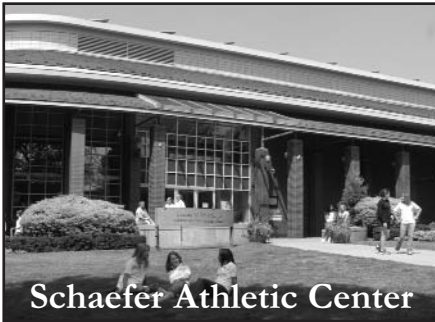

# Stevens Athletic Facilities

## THE STEVENS ADVANTAGE . . .

The Stevens Institute of Technology Athletic Complex is comprised of over \$20 million in facilities and caters to only 1,900 students.

Stevens opened its \$13 million Charles V. Schaefer, Jr. Athletic & Recreation Center in 1994. The Athletic Training Center contains a rubberized flooring which can accommodate soccer, tennis, basketball, volleyball and other activities. The second level contains the six-lane 25-yard De Baun Aquatic Center, a Jacuzzi, showers, locker rooms and an athletic training room. The third level features the Canavan Arena, a multi-purpose arena ideal for basketball, volleyball, fencing and other indoor activities. The top floor houses a fitness center containing cardiovascular and weight-training equipment plus a conference/classroom for video or personal instruction.

Walker Gymnasium re-opened in 2004 with its \$4 million modernizing renovation. The facility has central air conditioning, a state-of-the-art weightlifting facility, coaches' offices, five team locker rooms with showers, a recruiting lounge and many aesthetic upgrades. The main floor continues to house the basketball/volleyball court with a raised running track.

During the summer of 2007, the De Baun Athletic Complex underwent a major renovation as the existing NeXTurf surface was replaced with state-of-the-art FieldTurf. This marked a significant upgrade to the surface and provided Stevens with a first-class outdoor facility. The De Baun Athletic Complex is home to a number of varsity teams and is used for intramural sports, physical education classes and recreation.

Furthermore, in 2007, Stevens reached an agreement to share the brand-new Weehawken Recreation Center and Waterfront Park, which is located approximately two miles from campus. This facility will be used by varsity and intramural sports as well as campus recreation.

Stevens is one of few Division III institutions in the nation to establish a private strength and conditioning training facility (4,000 square foot) for exclusive use by its varsity athletes. Year-round strength and conditioning programs for each sport are devised through consultations between the sport's head coach and two full-time strength and conditioning coaches.
