The Stevens Institute of Technology men's volleyball team finished the week 3-1 overall and 3-0 against NECVA Metro competitors as it defeated Ramapo College, Polytechnic University and Bard College. The Ducks dropped their only match of the week to No. 1 Juniata College on Friday evening at the Canavan Arena.

Stevens was named the top overall seed as the pairings for the 16-team, single-elimination North East Collegiate Volleyball Association Men's Volleyball Championship were announced on Monday. The Ducks, who posted a perfect 14-0 mark in NECVA Metro Division play this year, will take on Brooklyn College in an opening round match on Friday at 2 p.m. The 2007 NECVA tournament will be held at Nazareth College in Rochester, N.Y., on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

If Stevens was to advance past Brooklyn, the Ducks (27-6) would then face the winner of No. 9 Rivier College and No. 8 Newbury College in the quarterfinals on Saturday at 11 a.m. The semifinals of the tourney will take place on Saturday at 3 p.m. The championship match is slated for Sunday at 1 p.m.

Stevens is a combined 21-0 against NECVA opponents this year. The NECVA consists of 35 schools, which are broken up into four divisions (Metro, CUNYAC, New England and Western). The Ducks have won two of the last four NECVA tournament titles (2003 and 2005).

Sophomore outside hitter **Tomas Bochicchio (Saint James, N.Y.)** led the Ducks against Ramapo with 14 kills, one ace, three blocks and five digs. He also led the team against Polytechnic with seven kills and one ace.

Against Ramapo, sophomore outside hitter/setter **Joe Trinsey (Wilmington, Del.)** was second on the team with nine kills and two aces. Senior middle hitter **Will Foley (Clifton Park, N.Y.)** chipped in with seven kills and three blocks. Senior setter/outside hitter **Michael Schulte (San Bernardino, Calif.)** was the leading setter with 41 assists. Schulte also added five digs.

Against Polytechnic, senior outside hitter **Sean Whelan (Springfield, Mass.)** contributed six kills, four aces and two blocks, while **John Dennon (Webster Groves, Mo.)** registered four kills, one ace and one block. Sophomore libero **Mike Bertucci (Gibbsboro, N.J.)** led the team with seven digs. Schulte totaled 17 assists, while freshman outside hitter **Andrew Fessler (Farmington, N.Y.)** had 10.

Juniata came away with a 36-34, 30-28, 30-23 victory on Friday. Sophomore middle hitter **Andrew Cranford (Bel Air, Md.)** led Stevens with 10 kills, while hitting .600 for three games (10-1-15).

All 18 players got to participate and Whelan led the team in kills with 11 as Stevens defeated Bard on Tuesday. Bochicchio was second on the team with eight kills. As a team, Stevens out-hit Bard .324 to .060.

After losing seven straight games, the Stevens Institute of Technology baseball team got back on track last week as the Ducks went 4-1 to raise their record to 6-9 on the year. Stevens is 4-0 in the Skyline Conference.

The Ducks began last week with a 7-4 loss to John Jay College in non-conference action on Wednesday. Over the weekend, Stevens put things together in a big way en route to sweeping doubleheaders from Maritime College and the United States Merchant Marine Academy.

On Saturday, Stevens snapped out of its recent slide with 18-4 and 11-2 victories against Maritime. Tied at 1-1 in the bottom of the second inning in the first game, Stevens pushed across three runs to grab the lead. Freshman **Russ Grimes (South Brunswick, N.J.)** highlighted the inning with an RBI single to right field.

The Ducks put the game out of reach with a seven-run outburst in the third. Senior **Andrew Tesoriero (Dunedin, Fla.)**, sophomore **Joe Gunshor (Ridgefield, Conn.)** and freshman **Eddie Daniele (Colts Neck, N.J.)** all had RBI singles.

Senior **Ryan Birkenstock (Smithville, N.J.)** sparked the Ducks' offense by going 3-for-6 with two RBI and two runs scored. Tesoriero added three hits, scored three runs and drove in a run as well. Senior **Adam Sandt (Allentown, Pa.)** went 2-for-2 with a double and three RBIs.

Sophomore **Alex Sota (Lancaster, Pa.)** picked up his first win of the season with seven solid innings of work. Sota allowed seven hits and three runs while striking out seven.

In the second game, Stevens broke open a 1-0 contest by scor-

ing seven runs in the bottom of the third inning. Sandt blasted a long three-run home run to left-center to stake the Ducks to a 4-0 lead. Stevens added four more runs later in the frame to extend the margin to 8-0.

Grimes, Gunshor and Sandt had two hits apiece in the win. Grimes also scored two runs. Gunshor, who had a home run for the Ducks, drove in two runs and scored twice.

Senior **Jim Waterman (Mullica Hill, N.J.)** was solid in his second start of the season. Waterman scattered five hits and struck out five batters in a complete-game effort.

On Sunday, Stevens pounded out a combined 20 hits and scored 22 runs en route to a sweep of USMMA. In the first game, junior **Scott Picerno (Bayonne, N.J.)** tied the all-time record for career wins at Stevens as he pitched the Ducks to a 13-4 victory. In two-plus seasons with the Ducks, Picerno has amassed 17 career victories. He is now tied with Eugene Tkac and Mike Belz in the record books at Stevens.

In Sunday's game against the Mariners, Gunshor helped Picerno's cause by going 4-for-5 with a pair of doubles, four RBIs and two runs scored. Grimes had two doubles, three RBIs and three runs scored.

During the second game, Stevens took advantage of some porous defense by the Mariners as USMMA committed 12 errors that ultimately contributed to a 9-3 win by the Ducks. In the fourth inning alone, Merchant Marine made six errors as a team. During that frame, Stevens scored five runs - four of which came with two outs - to blow open a 3-1 game.

Tesoriero went 2-for-4 with one RBI, a run scored and a stolen base in the victory. Tesoriero also recorded his 100th career hit with a single in the fourth inning. Grimes and Gunshor added two hits apiece for the Ducks.

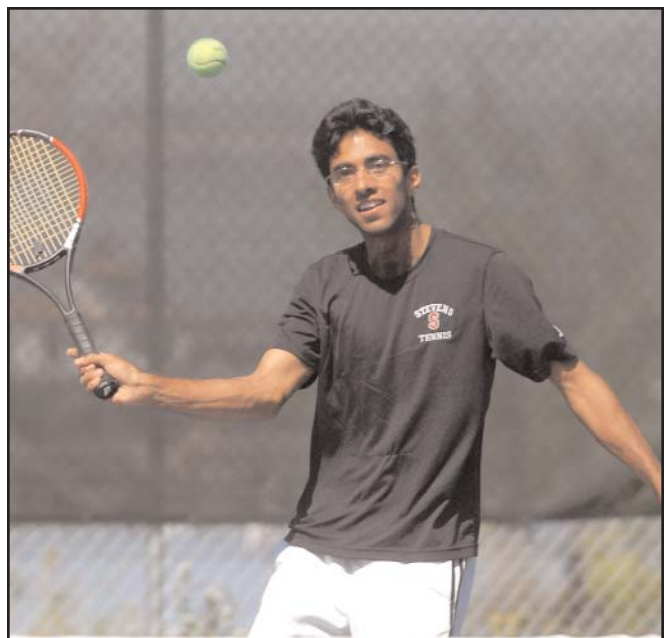

After returning from Orlando, Fla. the Stevens Institute of Technology women's lacrosse team hosted Cabrini College and dropped a 16-7 decision on Thursday evening at the De Baun Athletic Complex. On Saturday, the Ducks were defeated by Villa Julie College, 17-7. With the losses, the Ducks now stand at 3-4 on the season. Stevens will open up Skyline Conference play this week at Manhattanville College on Friday.

On Sunday, Villa Julie took a 1-0 lead when freshman midfielder **Lauren Zegowitz (Gaithersburg, Md.)** tallied the first goal 33 seconds into the game.

Junior midfielder/attack **Kaitlyn Roes (Stillwater, N.J.)** netted the Ducks first goal of the game on a pass from junior midfielder **Liz Mather (Chagrin Falls, Ohio)** at the 28:32 mark. Freshman midfielder **Alyssa Pigott (Jobstown, Pa.)** scored on a pass from Borzillo less than two minutes later and sophomore **Dana Perriello (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** picked up her first goal to give Stevens a 3-1 advantage.

The Mustangs scored the next three goals within a 6:11 span to regain a 4-3 edge over the Ducks. Perriello knotted the score at 4-4 with 4:12 remaining in the half, but Zegowitz gave Villa Julie the halftime advantage with 19 seconds on the clock.

The Mustangs went on to score 10 consecutive goals in the second half to jump out to a 15-4 lead. Perriello and Pigott each scored for the Ducks at the 8:48 and 6:40 marks before junior attack/midfielder **Jamie Jones (Glen Burnie, Md.)** grabbed an unassisted goal for Villa Julie. Last week, the Stevens Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team went 1-1 to run its record to 5-2 on the year. The Ducks are 3-0 in Skyline Conference play.

On the same day that he was named the Skyline Conference Player of the Week, junior attack **J.R. Oreskovich (San Diego, Calif.)** scored five goals on just seven shots as Stevens recorded an 11-8 victory over Montclair State University on Tuesday at Sprague Field in Montclair, N.J.

With Stevens leading 4-3 late in the first half, junior midfielder **John Dolny (Mountain Lakes, N.J.)** scored off a pass from senior midfielder **Mark Bielicky (Bridgewater, N.J.)** with 5:42 remaining in the second quarter to put the Ducks up by two. Bielicky added an unassisted goal with one second left on the clock as Stevens carried a 6-3 lead into halftime.

Less than two minutes into the third quarter, Oreskovich converted on a feed from sophomore attack **Eric Smith (Oswego, N.Y.)** as the Ducks opened a four-goal lead, 7-3. The Red Hawks scored three of the next four goals to close to within 8-6 later in the period.

Stevens put the game away by scoring three times in a six-minute stretch bridging the third and fourth quarters. Smith got things started with his second goal of the contest. Junior midfielder **Alex Richards (Beaverton, Ore.)** and Oreskovich also scored as the Ducks went on top 11-6 with 10:30 left.

Smith finished with two goals and three assists. He also had three ground balls. Bielicky recorded three points from a goal and two assists. Meanwhile, freshman midfielder **Bobby Steinhauser (Boonton Township, N.J.)** won nine faceoffs against Montclair. Senior goalkeeper **Jack Dunderdale**

(Ridgefield, Conn.) finished with 16 saves in the game.

On Sunday, senior goalkeeper **John Foley (Arthur, Ontario)** came up huge in net while making 17 saves on the afternoon as the second-ranked Rochester Institute of Technology men's lacrosse team posted a 10-5 win over Stevens at the De Baun Athletic Complex. Senior attack **Dave DeMuth (Jordan, N.Y.)** contributed three goals in the victory as the Tigers improved to 6-0 on the year.

Stevens came out strong and quickly grabbed a 2-0 lead in the opening 4:10 of the game as Oreskovich and senior midfielder **Joe Van Sickle (Amherst, N.H.)** found the back of the net. RIT responded with three straight goals to take a 3-2 lead. Junior midfielder **Andrew Ruocco (Corning, N.Y.)** tallied two of the three goals for the Tigers in that run.

Back-to-back goals by Van Sickle staked the Ducks to a 4-3 lead with 14:02 remaining in the second quarter. From that point on though, RIT's defense settled down and limited Stevens to just one goal the rest of the game.

Van Sickle finished with three goals for the Ducks. Oreskovich totaled four points from a goal and three assists. Bielicky recorded his 142nd career goal with 2.9 seconds remaining in the third quarter. That goal tied Bielicky with **Brian Lalli (Cranbury, N.J.)** for first place on the all-time list for career goals at Stevens. Lalli collected 142 goals and 54 assists (196 points) from 2001-04. Bielicky now has 191 career points.

Senior long-stick midfielder **Shane Crossen (New Milford, Conn.)** grabbed five ground balls against RIT. Senior defender **Steven Suggs (Durham, N.C.)** won five faceoffs in the game.
